Monday July the 12

All this day very fine weather All hands at work setting up Rizen and getting up topgall yards & mast got of Sun water & C signed the Log latter part of the Day Haines broke of Munk 3/16

Tuesday July the 13

This day commenced with bladdy weather Implied in setting up Rizen latter part very fine weather one sail came in to the harbor so ends the Day

Wednesday July the 14

Remark on board Wednesday July the 14 All this 24 hours very fine weather All hands Implied in fitting the Rizen & C Sailed 4 Cants on board to the bank ship so ends the Day

Thursday July the 15

Remark on board Thursday July the 15 All these 24 hours very fine weather All hands Implied in fitting the Rizen and sent in Munk lost four water so ends the Day & C

Friday July the 16

Remark on board Friday July the 16 All these 24 hours very fine weather All hands Implied in fitting Rizen got of two Raps or water and getting it held and C so ends the Day

Saturday July the 17

Remark on board Saturday July the 17 All these 24 hours very fine weather got All Munk four to go to see let Sun on the one go on liberty & two or three did not return At night so ends the Day

Sunday July the 18
Charles laid.

Remark on board Sunday July the 18 1841 All this day very fine weather At night the Pilot came to take the ship out called All hands and have short leed the sail got under way got out clear off All Sun got came to tow & C set up the bed Rizen shot the cables spoke the ship Charles Friedrich Kewbedford bound into the bay two men deserted Salaman longshore a Quaker's father set one on the shore on shore got away

Remark on board Monday July the 19 All this day very Rainy weather Ship under whole topgall off of the double kept the topgall from All points on the Cumfuo saw a bank ship standing off & on the people Implied in ship duty At night land distant 5 miles so ends the Day

to Newland from there to Chiles on a Whaling voyage

Friday July the 23

Remark on board Friday July the 23 All this day very fine weather Strong trade All sail set to Advantage Steaming S by E one ship in life sent down the cutting Benaris and shortened them sent them up ship under double kept topgall & C so ends the day batt 19-24 long 7:1

Saturday July the 24

Remark on board Saturday July the 24 All this 24 hours very good weather an the breeze from the SE Steaming South E by S the people Implied in driving yannes & knotting them & At night spoke the ship Elvise so ends the Day & batt 2 long 7:1

Sunday July the 25

Remark on board Sunday July the 25 All these 24 hours light breeze from SE to SSE All sail set to Advantage Steaming to the South & Eastward latter part of the day spoke the Elvise ship in life I told All hands at West at night squally & Sun Rain kept the four & mile off sail the Cumfuo & good cab or oil subbed our oil ends 23 batt 21:23 Long 7 so ends the Day
