Monday October the 4
 Remark on board Monday October the 4
 this day commenced with very strong winds and I had see on the ship to town saw whale but could not town on the about in the see I employed in boiling the whales at one PM got through boiling the whales saw I sail to the Eastward lat 34 32 Long 1 72 09

Tuesday October the 5
 Remark on board Tuesday October the 5 1541
 this day commenced with very strong winds & I had see on ship under a lost left main topsail & foresail winds from the ESE bedding SE & NW saw one sail to the Port Wind drift of saw whales but it came up thick and foggy & I had see on latter long 1 6 So ends the day

Wednesday October the 6
 Remark on board Wednesday October the 6
 this day good weather at daylight made all sail light to show down the air saw one sail saw whales lined in chase but they was too wild for us went on board commenced string took the whale to the ship and put him in saw whales 3 miles off took down 35 barrels of oil at night took in sail lat 35 00 long 1 72 30

Thursday October the 7
 Remark on board Thursday October the 7
 this day commenced with very strong winds from the West employed in boiling the whale saw whales lined in chase but could not get near a whale came on board ship under a loose left topsails at one PM took in sail and lost left the main topsail latter part of sail halting to the Eastward had some hard squalls so ends lat 35 00 long 1 71

Friday October the 8
 Remark on board Friday October the 8 1544
 this day very strong winds from the West halting to the Eastward at daylight lost left main topsail and foresail latter part of sail increasing thick in the forenoon could not see the try works lat long very bad see on

Saturday October the 9
 Remark on board Saturday October the 9
 this day commenced with a gale from the SE resolved it moderated from SE to the forenoon and set the try works saw at night got through boiling set the main topsail weather moderating part lat 32 44 long 1 71 47 West ends

Sunday October the 10
 Remark on board Sunday October the 10
 this day strong winds at daylight commenced string down the oil between decks took the oil 90 barrels & it the waffer setting up smoke all sail set to seaward bearing to the SW saw a sail spoke saw the General Williams saw some 200 barrels 10 minutes out saw him take a night sail at night took in sail lat 33 07 long 1 72 29

Monday October the 11
 Remark on board Monday October the 11
 this day commenced with the winds from the SE at daylight made sum sail bedding down to the SE and very foggy weather until one PM lit up sun & commenced with the General Williams saw him back at night shortened sail lat 34 10 long 1 71 25

Tuesday October the 12
 Remark on board Tuesday October the 12
 this day very strong winds and I had see on at daylight set double left topsails gill & ble bedding to the SE saw three sails saw whales lined in chase but could not get near them did not hear no more at 3 PM wind held to SW took ship bedded W by lat 34 50 long 1 71 47

Wednesday October the 13
 Remark on board Wednesday October the 13
 this day commenced with light winds from the Northward standing to the NW saw whales lined in chase but could not get near them saw a ship take whale at night came on board side the ship saw the Sulzer an or breman 25 hundred barrels 16 months out at half past four lined from 14 whale & then him killed him got the whale to the ship and put two of his ropes on him saw three ships at night took in sail lat 35 00 long 1 72 25

Thursday October the 14
 Remark on board Thursday October the 14
 this day commenced with very strong westerly winds at daylight commenced cutting the whale got him in 32 saw minor whale lined in chase struck one and killed him took him to the ship & put him in saw two ships saw minor whale but it was too low at night took in sail set the try work & going lat long

Friday October the 15
 Remark on board Friday October the 15 1544
 this day strong SW wind at daylight set double left topsail had see on spoke the ship saw breman or breman 35 hundred barrels 16 months out saw two rather ships no whale bedded to the SE & NW at 2 PM shortened sail at night lost left the main topsail employed in boiling the whale lat 35 07 long 1 71 48

Saturday October the 16
 Remark on board Saturday October the 16
 this day strong winds & I had see on ship under a lost left main topsails & foresail bedding to the Westward & to the SE employed in boiling the whales saw three sails no whales in site I will so ends the day lat 34 51 long 1 71 31 West ends the day
