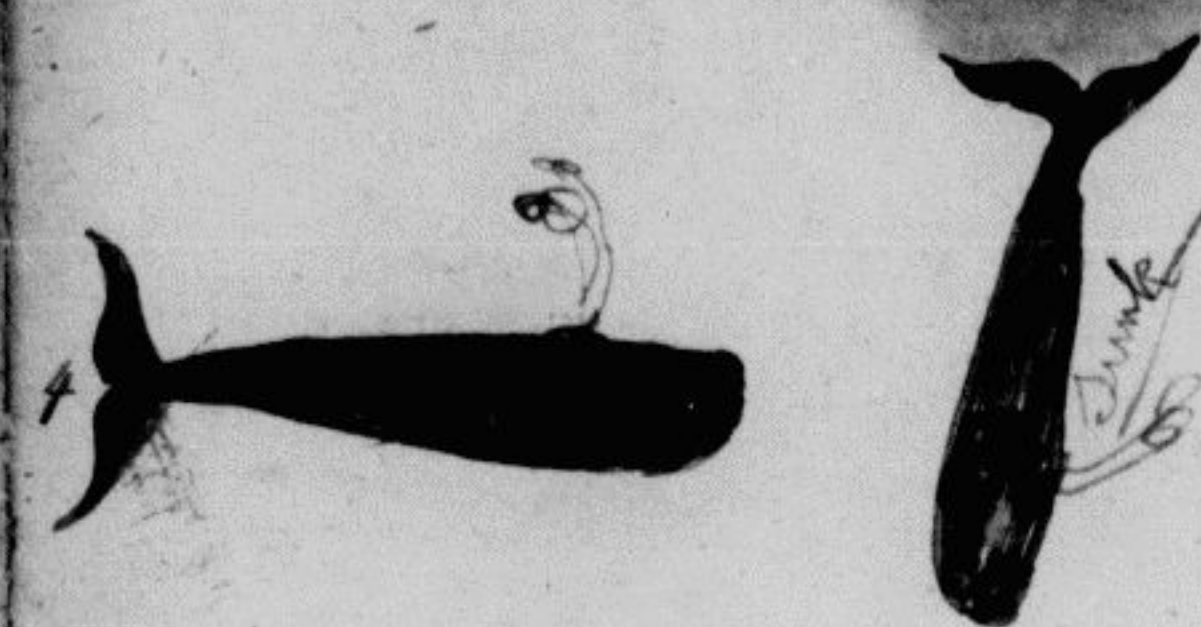


Journal of A Whaling voyage from Stonington to Newland from

Wednesday November
 the 24



this day very good weather fine breeze from the N.W. All sail set Steaming S.E. At 9 AM saw a large or small whale At 9 got up near a drift to lose the boat in chase struck two killed one and he sunk the other one I used from At 3 PM saw more whales killed four boats in chase struck one killed him took the whale to the ship. Commence cutting got his head & lips before 5 PM let the body lay until morning took in sail lost 3 longi

Thursday November
 the 25

Remark on board Thursday November the 25
 this day commences with squally weather strong winds from the Westward At daylight it moderated sun commences cutting. One ship cut to the leeward got him in Made all sail Steaming S.E. until 12 then left of East cutting in life At night double sheet the topsail Imploded in boiling the whale lat 36 30 longi 161 53 At 8 took in sail hose ten kedid all

Friday November
 the 26

Remark on board Friday November the 26
 this day commences with thick and hazy weather At daylight made sail Steaming East latter part very light. One from the N.E. heading to the E.S.E. the people Imploded in boiling the whale nothing in life At night got through boiling the whale he made 40 barrels lat 36 30 longi 161 12

Saturday November
 the 27



Remark on board Saturday November the 27
 this day very fresh winds from the N.W. All sail set Steaming to the Eastward At 10 PM saw a ship & boiling took in sail by 11 At daylight made sail saw finbacks At 9 PM saw a small whale to the leeward in chase struck him killed him At 10 PM got the whale to the ship. Put the large fluke hoop on him saw one ship to the S.W. as he ended the day took in sail lat 36 42 longi 180 00 West

Sunday November

Remark on board Sunday November the 28
 this day commences with fresh winds At daylight got the body from cutting the whale At half past 4 got him in Made sail Steaming East stands from the N.W. let the top masts & going the weather looking hard double kept the topsails Steaming At 6 PM E.S.E. lat 37 00 longi 169 28 West

 this day fresh winds from the Westward Steaming E.S.E. At daylight made all sail Imploded in boiling the whale At 12 PM got through boiling the whale and nothing in life this day we take our departure from lat 37 30 longi 158 00 West four hours bound

this day very good weather All sail set Steaming East saw one finback At night whales wind At 10 PM the people Imploded in making topsail braces & sheets & Rove up sun rigging and stored down the oil in the main hatch 30 barrels lat 34 19 longi 135 10 West

Remark on board Wednesday December the 1
 this day very fresh wind from the N.W. All sail set Steaming E.S.E. got up Stunsails boom on the yards on board the gib & bent A Southern got up the Stunsails & commenced repairing them making rigging & lat 38 52 longi 152 52

Thursday December
 the 2

Remark on board Thursday December the 2
 this day commences with strong N.W. winds Steaming East All sail set to Advantage the people Imploded in fitting the ship and nothing in life lat 39 45 longi 149 30 West took in the short lot & bow lot

Friday December
 the 3

Remark on board Friday December the 3
 this day very strong N.W. winds All sail set Steaming East got the Stunsails mended and bent them to the yards and sent them out latter part squally took in the Stunsails the main topsail & parted the people Rigging ship & lat 39 46 longi 145 32 West

Saturday December
 the 4

Remark on board Saturday December the 4
 this day very gails and cloudy weather Steaming from East to E by first part all sail latter part double kept the topsails which from Southward nothing in life the people Imploded in ships duty lat 39 31 longi 142 32

Sunday December
 the 5

Remark on board Sunday December the 5
 this day commences & ends with very strong S.W. winds Steaming East and E by ship under double kept topsails latter part made more sail weather more moderate So ends the day lat 39 longi 138 55 West

Monday December
 the 6

Remark on board Monday December the 6
 this day very strong winds from the N.W. All sail set Steaming East & E by set the Stunsails the people Imploded in fitting ship & nothing in life but foppiness So ends the day 39 46 longi 135 56 West
