Tuesday January
the 11

Remark on board Tuesday January the 11
this day commenced with strong gales from the NW
steaming all ship under double reefed sails at
daylight wind decreased & held around to SW till all sail
set Stunsails fine weather fresh winds lat 36.19 long 39.53

Wednesday January
the 12

Remark on board Wednesday January the 12
this day very fine weather all sail set to advantage
winds NW until 9 AM wind held to NW heading
of latter part very light breeze and clear weather
in the Stunsails latitude 34.43 long 39.01

Thursday January
the 13

Remark on board Thursday January the 13
this day very light winds from the South to NW all sail
set to advantage standing to the SE at 10 AM saw one
finback the people employed in fitting ship & to latter part
held up at 2 PM lat 34.26 long 38.46 so ends the day

Friday January
the 14
1842

this day very light winds from the NW to South heading
to the NW all sail set to advantage nothing in late
the people employed in fitting ship & to got out the mast
lat 33.40 long 38.20 so ends the day

Saturday January
the 15

Remark on board Saturday January the 15
this day commenced with fresh winds from the NW heading
all sail set to advantage nothing in late
took in the sails at 10 AM so this day ends with
fresh northerly winds lat 32.53 long 37.24

Sunday January
the 16

Remark on board Sunday January the 16
this 24 hours very thick and hazy weather all sail
set to advantage steaming from NW to SE nothing
in late latter part held up at 10 AM so ends the
day lat 32.23 long 37.07

Monday January

this day very hazy weather all sail set steaming
winds at 10 AM the people employed in scraping ship & to
latter part light winds lat 31.19 long 35.47 west

heading all ship under all sail at 10 AM saw three
whales three miles of did not see them again until 2 PM
saw whales breach three miles of to the leeward run of whale
see see them but they did not come in late again so ends
the day lat 30.26 long 35.23 west

this day strong SE winds heading to the NW all sail
set to advantage at 10 AM took ship heading to eastward
nothing in late the people employed in fitting ship & to
latter part very cloudy water lat 29.32 long 36.24

Friday January
the 21

Remark on board Friday January the 21
this day commenced with fresh breeze from the NW heading
to the eastward latter part clear part part or there 24
hours thick weather all sail set the people employed in fitting
ship and the carpenter repairing things around the ship
lat 29.39 long 33.00

Saturday January
the 22

Remark on board Saturday January the 22
this 24 hours very light winds from the NW heading
all sail set to advantage the people
employed in fitting ship & the carpenter making of hall
raising for the wheel lat 29.25 long 31.00

Sunday January
the 23

Remark on board Sunday January the 23
this day commenced with light breeze from the NW
heading all sail set to advantage saw 6
sails or blackfish latter part very fine weather light
breeze lat 29.05 long 32.45 long 34.24

Monday January
the 24
1842

Remark on board Monday January the 24
this day very light breeze from the NW heading to the NW
all sail set to advantage saw 6 sails to the SE - us
standing so ends the day parted the ship around
out side and to lat 28.29 long 32.02

Tuesday January
the 25
1842

Remark on board Tuesday January the 25
this day very light breeze from the NW all sail set
to advantage heading to the SE at 10 AM the people employed
in fitting ship saw 1 sail at 10 AM the ship within one
mile land so that went on board the was a Spanish brig
No bodies on board all the English came on board a
gale lat 28.14 south long 31.22 west
