inclined to go up slowly.
at a very strong breeze

Day has been a Gale
from N.W. with heavy
squalls kept off at 3-30 A.M.
at 3-30 got steam
topsails set - but had to
take them in again
P.M. plenty wind heavy
squalls run until 3 P.M.
so thick and snow
and coming on dark
think it best not to
attempt to go through
night - think Cape
Cort is S.E. 15 miles
