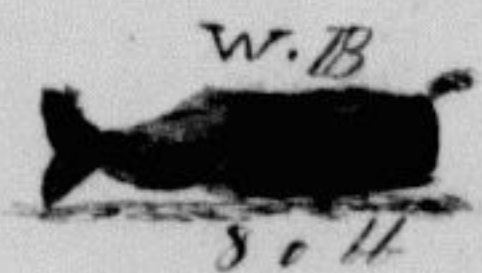


REMARKS ON BOARD AUG 1846

11th MON AUG 17th These 24 hours light wind and pleasant this morning at day light made all sail the fore part of this day all hands employed in setting up the rigging. At 11 AM raised a large Spumie whale. At noon lowered the boats. At two PM the west boat struck and got capsized. Starboard boat struck him and turned him up. At 5 PM hauled him along side. At the last part of this day all hands employed in taking out and mending cutting gear. At sunset Shortland Sail two Shells in sight.

12th TUESDAY AUG 18th These 24 hours light wind and pleasant at daylight commenced cutting in at 5 PM had his body all cut in and then cleared away for boiling at 7 PM began to boil out Saw Black Fish.

13th WEDNESDAY AUG 19th

These 24 hours light wind and pleasant at daylight cooled down the Works and Colled all hands and hooked on to the junk and hove it in they broke chains parted and we lost his mast at 10 AM began to boil out again.

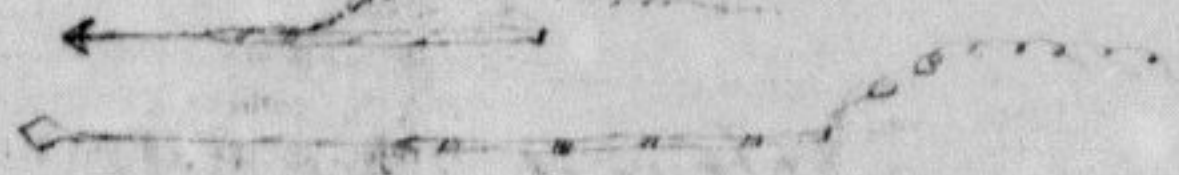

These fore part of this day light Wind and pleasant the latter part Squally with rain all hands employed in taking out Saw they carcass of a Whale 1 Sail in sight.

FRIDAY AUG 21th

20 These 24 hours squally with heavy rain all hands employed in doffing out this day spoke the ship Charlotte of London down to Liverpool this night laying by the wind.

22 SATURDAY AUG 22th

These 24 hours squally with heavy rain at 1 the night cooled down at daylight Colled all hands and commenced clearing away of Storing down at 8 AM began to store down this day got 50th down this day 1 Sail in sight laying by the wind.

23 SUNDAY AUG 23th

These 24 hours strong wind and squally with rain at daylight raised Spumie Whales at sunrise toward the boats and got close but did not get fast came on board and hoisted up the boats at 1 PM raised Spumie Whales again and lowered the boats and the tubs and boat struck one and at 4 PM got him along side all hands employed in clearing away for cutting in this day.

24 MONDAY AUG 24th

This part of this day squally with heavy rain at daylight Colled all hands and at 8 AM commenced taking in and at 1 PM got him cut in and then commenced clearing away his head and at 2 PM began to boiling out this day one Sail in sight laying by the wind.
