These 24 hours light wind and pleasant
all hands employed in baying out and
fitting boat gear at sunset saw
A school of Black Fish nothing more
in sight to day saw none these 24 hours

WEDNESDAY AUG 26th

These 24 hours strong wind and very
rough pulled the watch at 7 AM and
at 8 AM commenced stowing down and
at 8 PM got three this day spoke the
St. Pierre of Bismarck 5 months with
30 lb

These 24 hours strong wind and pleasant
this day saw A school of Black Fish nothing
more in sight to day the watch employed
in ship duty it is very rough to day

These 24 hours light wind and pleasant this
morning at daylight pulled all hands and washed
off decks and at 8 AM commenced stowing down

get fast and at 4 PM came on board and howled up
the boats last night saw A sail the boat along on the
water but did not speak her got three stowing
at sunset

employed in washing and mending at 6 AM raised hands

none these 24 hours Stowing by the wind

These 24 hours light wind and very pleasant
Watch employed in ship duty this day spoke
the Bark Dr. Franklin of Portland 13 months
on with 250 lb and cutting in A large whale

her better and sail more in sight nothing more
in sight but A school of Grampas saw
none these 24
