These 24 hours strong wind but pleasant watch employed in ship duty this morning 8 o'clock saw a black two points on the water here we run for it but did not see it again this morning saw a school of Black Fish three miles off going quick to windward did not follow this afternoon saw another break but pursued to be nothing nothing more in sight. See ends these 24 hours
