WEDNESDAY Nov 4th
 These 24 Hours light wind
 and pleasant this morning
 called all hands and made
 all sail and washed off this
 morning broke out fore sails
 sent it via staysail and sent
 down the foretop sail and mended
 it and at 4 clock sent it up
 again to night at sunset
 shortened sail to three these
 24 Hours

THURSDAY Nov 5th

These 24 Hours light wind and
 pleasant this morning called all
 hands and made all sail and
 washed off the first thing after
 breakfast turned up the starboard
 sail to point and then sent
 down the mainmast to mend
 and at 2 clock sent it up
 again this afternoon raised
 the main to points on the starboard
 low no keep off but did not it
 sea again one sail in sight
 this night took in the light
 sails the wind these 24 Hours

FRIDAY Nov 6th
 These 24 Hours light wind and
 pleasant this morning called
 all hands and made all sail
 and washed off and then turned

 in setting up the mainmast
 rigging to day saw two backs
 and one sail in sight
 the end these 24 Hours

SATURDAY Nov 7th

These 24 Hours strong wind
 and pleasant this morning
 called all hands and made
 all sail and washed off to day
 wearing S.W. by S. to night at

SUNDAY Nov 8th

These 24 Hours strong wind
 and cloudy this morning called
 all hands and made all sail
 and washed off this morning
 kept off again one sail in sight
 to night shortened sail to day
 came W. to night hauled by

 Hours
