DEC 1846

FRIDAY DEC 11th

This Day Strong Wind and pleasant
this morning called all hands and
washed off this morning kept off S.W.B.W
3 Mails in sight spoke 4 French Ships
from Luis bound to Rio but it
was manifest. We ended this day
at sun set left to the Wind N.E.
LAT 18.11
LONG 36.28

SUNDAY DEC 12th

This Day Strong Wind and pleasant
this morning called all hands and
washed off this morning kept off S.W.B.W.
at sun set left to the Wind N.E.
We ended this day
LAT 20.15
LONG 36.38

SUNDAY DEC 13th

The part of this day Strong
Wind and pleasant latter part
Strong Wind with squalls of rain
at daylight called all hands
and raised sail and washed off
at 6 P.M. kept off W.B.S. and in
the afternoon took 2 reefs in the
topsails on sail in sight and at
dusk put the vessel and left to the
Wind and at 10 O'clock kept off again
We ended this day Wind N.E.
LAT 21.54
LONG 37.00

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MONDAY DEC 14th

The part of this day Strong Wind
and pleasant latter part light Wind
this morning at daylight called all hands
and washed off this afternoon raised all
sail on sail in sight this night
commenced standing by watches at noon
this day
Course W.B.S.
Wind N.E.
LAT 22.51
LONG 38.45

TUESDAY DEC 15th

This Day Strong Wind and pleasant
this morning called all hands and
washed off this day bake out for
provisions on sail in sight
We ended this day Course W.B.N.
Wind S.E.
LAT 23.37
LONG 38.33

WEDNESDAY DEC 16th

The part of this day light Wind
and pleasant this forenoon raised
sail from this afternoon shot down
the foretopgallant sail to mend and
shot it up again 2 sail in sight
We ended this day Course W.B.N.
Wind E.S.E.
LAT 23.15
LONG 38.00
