Remarks Sunday May 31st (cont)
Fore part of this day commences with strong
wind from the N.W. and pleasant at daylight
called all hands and made sail and worked
off Middle part equally with sails until employed
in ship duty at sunset shortened sail
the fore part and close up the main
to the wind. It ends this day. Lat

Remarks Monday June 1st (cont)
Fore and middle part of this day commences
with moderate wind from the E.S.E. and
pleasant at daylight called all hands and
made sail and worked off at 6 A.M. lowered
for black fish but did not get fast 7 A.M. came
on board and sail in light better part equally
with sails at sunset shortened sail
to the wind. It ends this day. Lat

These 24 hours commences and ends with
light wind from the N. and pleasant this
morning called all hands and made sail
and worked off 5 sails in light until
employed in ship duty at sunset shortened
sail. It ends this day. Lat

These 24 hours commences and ends
with light wind from the N. and pleasant
this morning called all hands and made
sail and worked off 6 sails in light at
9 A.M. sent down the main topgallant sail
to mend at 4 sent it up again at 1 P.M.
lowered for black fish but did not get fast
at sunset shortened sail. It ends this day. Lat

Fore part and middle part wind from the
N.E. by E. and pleasant this morning called
all hands and made sail and worked off
2 sails in light until employed in ship
duty at sunset shortened sail. It ends this day. Lat

Remarks Friday June 5th
This day commences with light wind from
the N.W. and pleasant this morning called
all hands and made sail and worked off
at 8 A.M. lowered the fore part and went on board
of the sch. Fishery of Kingston a day before
Boston and the West Indies to day broke out
for provisions and fore sail in light this morning
kept off E.S.E. at sunset shortened sail.
It ends this day. Lat

This day commences with moderate wind
from the N.W. thick weather this morning
called all hands and made sail and
worked off this day the main topgallant
sail at 8 A.M. lowered the fore part
for black fish but did not get fast at
sunset shortened sail. It ends this day. Lat

Fore and middle part of this day commences
with strong wind from the S.E. with thick
weather this morning called all hands and made
sail and worked off until employed in ship duty
better part however rain the wind bore round to
the N.E. at sunset shortened sail. It ends this day. Lat
