

Monday July 21st 1839 Ship's Log

First part of this day fresh breezes from the S.S. and Rainy Middle part fresh winds and pleasant latter much the same. Roanoke Beam to the land steering E by S Lat 37.45 Long 62.35

Monday 22nd

First part of this day fresh winds with Rain Middle part light winds, spoke the Roanoke, latter part fresh breezes from the S steering E.S. Lat 37.15 Long 61.44

Tuesday 23rd

First part light breezes from the S.S. latter part strong winds from the S.S. and Rainy Squalls 3 sails in sight the Roanoke Beam to the windward for a mile off - steering E by S for ends this day Lat 37 Long 61.55

Wednesday 24th

First part of this day strong breezes and squally Middle and latter part fresh breezes from the S.S. and clear weather steering E by S Roanoke astern 5 miles Dis and 1 other sail a stern Lat 37.10 Long 62.29

Thursday 25th

First and Middle part of this day squally latter part fresh breezes from the S.S. steering E by S same A Brig steering N.W. the Roanoke 2 points off our bow quarter 3 miles Distance - Lat 37.04 Long 62.72

Ship's Log Greenport

Friday July 26th 1839

All this day strong winds from the S and pleasant weather steering E by S the Roanoke Beam to the land at 6 P.M. sent the flag Lat 37.26 Long 64.47

July 27th spoke the Roanoke

Saturday 27th

All this day strong breezes from the S steering E by S and pleasant weather at 6 o'clock A.M. spoke the Roanoke Lat 37.25 Long 64.51

Sunday 28th

Fine breeze from the N.W. and pleasant weather steering E.S. 2 sails in sight Roanoke and the Brig steering N.E. Lat 37.27 Long 65

Monday 29th

First part fine weather and a strong breeze from the N.W. steering E by S Middle part light winds from the N.W. and clear weather Lat 37.42 Long 63.55

Tuesday 30th

July 30th spoke the Roanoke

First and Middle light breezes from the N.W. steering E same several Grampuses, spoke the Roanoke 4 other sails in sight A Brig steering N.W. steering latter part fine wine and pleasant weather Lat 38.08 Long 64.43

Wednesday 31st

First part light winds and pleasant weather latter part strong breezes from the N.W. steering E. 2 sails in sight Roanoke the other steamer Lat 38.30 Long 65.63
