Thursday August 1st 1839
First part light breezes from the N
And pleasant weather at 4 o'clock in the
morning Made the Island of Pagal &
Pico At 1 o'clock 8 miles off left for the
Town. At 12 o'clock we were off
the Town with the Ship Bird
Roanoke 10 miles to the Seward of
the Island. The remainder of the
Day standing off and on betwix
the two Islands & 10 ships in sight

Friday 2nd
The first part of this Day light
winds from N.W. and cloudy. Latter
part strong breezes from the S.
with rain squalls. At 2 o'clock the Launch
came along side took on board 176 Bushels
Potatoes 15 or 20 cabbages some green corn cabbage
and a few other things. At 5 o'clock got
came on board squatted the yards and
sailed around the back side of the Island
sent a boat ashore and got 3 Portuguese
1 for the Roanoke and 2 for us.
Were ship and stored 150 lbs
first part of the evening light breezes
And calm latter part strong breezes
from the S.W. and cloudy.

Saturday 3rd

First part of this day strong breezes
from the S.W. steering S by S & by S
Weather middle part more moderate
latter part calm saw one or two grampings
the Roanoke one point brought over weather
p. beam Lat 35 14, Long 28 15

Sunday August 4th 1839.
First part of this day calm and pleasant
middle part a light breeze from
the South latter part calm saw
a jumper and 3 or 4 killings. The
Roanoke 1 mile South of us
And 1 more sail to the Eastward
Lat 36 20, S. Long 28 00. West

Monday 5th
First part calm and a very little
shower of rain much calm all
hands employed to make out the
hole for water. Latter part
a considerable thunder and lightning,
squally and rain. The Roanoke 1 mile
S. & Stern. Lat 35 49 Long 27 59

Tuesday 6th
First part thunder squalls and rain
light breezes from the S.W. steering S by S
At 9 o'clock in the morning the Fore Top sail
Schooner James of London put up showing S.
And a Brig steering the same way At 4 o'clock
P.M. sight on board of the Roanoke Lat 34 52
Long 27 44

Wednesday 7th
This Day begins with light winds and
pleasant weather steering S by S. & by S
Calm and pleasant No observation
This Day

Thursday 8th
First part calm and pleasant latter
much the same At 12 o'clock a boat
And got a turtle At 3 o'clock and got
a turtle. The Roanoke bears S
Dis 3 miles. Lat 33 32 Long 27 07. W
