August 21st 1838 Ship Triad
First part strong breezes from
the S.E. At 7 o'clock the cap left
for the shore and three or four
boats came along side to Trade
At 11 o'clock the same off took
the sick man Joseph Anthony
formerly of New Orleans a shore
At 12 Noon Captain came on board
Squared the yards and steered South
with a strong breeze from
the S.E. At sundown at Yago
Bore N.E. the latter part strong
breezes from the E.S. And rain
squalls steering S.W.

Thursday 22^d.
First part of this day strong breezes
from the S.E. wind by the wind
and rainy squally weather and the
rest part of the day much the
same saw 1 sail to the Westward
Lat 13.30 Long Unknown

Friday 23^d
First part strong gales from the
W.S.W. and squally weather rain
steering S.W. Under S.E. Middle
part more moderate Lat 12.50. Lat

Saturday 24th
All this day light breezes from
the W. steering S.W. and pleasant
weather Lat 12.00 Long 24.22 W

Sunday 25th
First part of this day light breezes
from the W. At 10 o'clock saw a ship to the
the remainder of the day much the
same as the first Lat 12.00

Monday 26th of August
All this day light breezes from the W.
steering S.W. with pleasant all hands
employed braking out betrix jacks and
steering back again Lat 12.33.

Tuesday 27th
This day has past away with strong
winds from the W. steering
S.W. And clear pleasant weather
Lat Long 20.00

Wednesday 28th
First part of this day strong breezes
from the S.W. steering on the
wind with the Starboard Tacks ahead
heading to the S.E. Past 2 or 3 ships
on the other tack. Latter part of
this day more moderate and pleasant
Lat By Cap 6. 26. Long 19.98 By Chron

Thursday 29th
All this day light breezes from the
S.W. steering first on one tack and
then on the other a trying to
get to the S. 5 sails in sight
Spoke the Columbia Reimbarked
bound around Cape Horn
Lat By Chron Long
