

October 8th 1839 Ship's head
All this day light breezes
from the E. & steering S.E.
Saw 1 or 2 fin backs and
some porpoises At sundown
Tacked ship heading P.
D.R. the Topsails 46. Lat 35.54
Cloudy weather, long unknown

Thursday
Wednesday 9th
All this day light winds
from the N.E. steering to
the Eastward. And good weather
Saw 2 Suffer Bottoms and 2
fin backs - Lat 35.45
Long 21.27

Thursday 10th
All this day strong breezes
from the N. At 7 o'clock
more ship and steamed N by W
Bound towards the far Banks
Cloudy weather Saw 1 fin back
At Ends this Day Lat 36.10

Friday 11th
This day begins with strong breezes
from the S.W. steering N.W. by W.
under D.R. thick cloudy weather
Middle & latter part Made all sail
At sundown D.R. the Topsails
steering N. Lat 36.00
Long 22.49

Saturday 12th
First part of this day light breezes from the N.
steering on the wind to the N. At noon Tacked
ship heading S.W. by W. Saw several
fin backs, and porpoises latter part
wind more towards the N. heading
W.S.W. Lat 35.20 Long 23.10

Sunday October 13th 1839
First part light winds from the S.W.
steering W. under all sail latter part
strong breezes and squally took in Top
Gallant sails At Sundown took in sail
Saw some porpoises but no Whales
Lat 35.34 Long 24.17

Monday 14th of October This Day Commenced
With fresh breezes from the S.W.
steering W. by N. & equally saw one
fin back and a few porpoises Middle
and latter part good weather wind
more to the S made all sail At 12
past 6 o'clock spoke Right the Topsails
steering W. by N. Lat 35.30 Long 25.25

Tuesday 15th This day passes with a light
breeze from the S. and pleasant
weather steering W. under all
sail. Saw several fin backs
At 12 past 6 o'clock took in Top Gallant
- sails steering W. Lat 35.47 South
Long by Chronometer 28.08 West
By Lunar 28.14 West

Wednesday 16th First part of this strong
breezes from the W. steering S.W.
Saw At 10 o'clock saw three Whales
& 1 Whale lowered boats & lost and
got nothing At 12 o'clock Tacked
ship stood to the Northward
latter part a gail of wind took
in sail Lat 36.17 Long 28.44

Thursday 17th All this day a gail of wind
from the W. steering N. by W. saw
2 Whales and a school of
porpoises Lat 35.25 Long 28.12
