

Ship Triad F M Case Master
Friday November 15th 1839

First part of this day strong gails from the N^W blowing on the wind and rainy, thick weather saw seven Wright Whale lowered Boats, twice but did not get fast, saw two ships. Latter part more moderate but thick rainy weather saw a great many fin backs. At 5 o'clock O. M. spoke the Arabella Sag Harbor one Wright Whale 30 Bbls of sperm. Heard from the Atlantic of Bridgeport 70 Bbls Wright Whale and two hundred sperm. Lat 35.38. Long 33.14. West.

Saturday 16th of November 1839

First part of this day light winds from the N^W and thick weather saw 3 ships, saw the Arabella take a whale. Middle and latter parts fresh gails and thick foggy weather striking O. M. under all sail saw nothing at all. At 6 o'clock took in' studd and wore ship. Heading W by N. No Observations this Day of our Lord

Sunday 17th of November 1839

First part of this day a gail of wind from the N^W heading NNE and thick rainy weather. Laying to under O. M. And fore Tynest staccil spencers &c. Latter part wind from the SSW heading W and thick weather saw the Arabella boiling and one more ship to the leeward. At 5 o'clock wore ship heading E by N under O. M. and Foresail &c. Saw no whale of no kind this Day of our Lord and Saviour.

Lat 35.55. Long 33.14. West

in the North Atlantic Ocean
Monday 18th of November 1839

First part of this day strong gails from the N^W and usually near the entering on the wing saw seven one Wright whale lowered twice for him but did not get fast. Latter part very squally saw 4 ships the Delta Green Port, Arabella and spoke the Atlantic of Bridgeport. 2 Wright Whale 200 Bbls of Sperm. The Delta had 20 Bbls of sperm. Heard from the Noble New Suffolk 100 Bbls Sperm one N^W Whale — Lat 35.45. Long 33.31

Tuesday 19th Fresh breezes and squally near shore steering N by W wind was W saw 5 ships and several porpoises. Latter part heavy squalls and hail. Lat 35.35. Long 33.42. D R F

Wednesday 20th of Nov

First part of this day strong gails from the N^W and clear weather. Saw one porpoise. Latter part light breeze from the WSW made sail S. S. Steaming south. Saw 2 ships spoke the Delta 20 Bbls of sperm. Lat 35.43. Long 34.35.

Thursday 21st of Nov

First part of this day strong gails and clear weather saw two ships and spoke them Delta and Atlantic. The Atlantic had a man full from the fore topsail yard and brook his thigh and arm a day or two previous. Latter part of this day strong gails and thick rainy weather took in sail heading S W by S wind N by E. Lat 35.53.
