Sunday 6th of December 1839 A. D.
All this Day light breezes from the
N. W. Steering N. E. W. and pleasant
Weather Saw two porpoises

Monday 7th of December
This day commences with light
breezes and calm. Middle and latter
parts light breezes from the E. N. E.
Steering N. E. W. under all sail cloudy
weather saw nothing at all this
Day Lat By Obs 37.55. Long 38.54

Tuesday 8th of December 1839
First part of this day light breezes
from the E. S. E. Steering N. W. and
thick foggy weather latter part
light breezes and clear weather
Saw nothing at all
Lat By Obs 37.03. Long 37.40

Wednesday 9th of December
First part of this day light breezes
from the E. S. E. and thick foggy
weather Middle part light breezes
and clear weather made all sail
steering N. W. at 5 O'clock squared
the yards steering N. W. strong breeze
from the S. S. E. took in Top Gullard Sails
spraker and Mainwail the remainder
of the day thick fog and rainy
at 8 took in sail hove two
under Close R. Y. S. and fore Topmast
staysail. Main spraker
Saw nothing this day but
Birds and I am afraid we
never shall see no more
Whales this season
Lat By Obs 38.03. Long 38.04 West

Thursday 10th of December 1839
Throughout this Day fresh breezes
from the N. W. Steering S. E. and
thick foggy Weather saw some
porpoises but no Whales of no
Description at 6 O'clock took in sail
heading N. E. W. Lat 38.15

Friday 11th of December
The first part of this Day thick foggy
weather with light breezes from
the N. E. W. Steering S. E. under full
Top sails Middle and latter parts
made all sail steering to the N. E. W.
Clear and pleasant weather saw
nothing at all this Day. but a few
Birds Lat 38.43. Long By Obs 38.45. By Sun 38.53

Saturday 12th of December 1839 S. D. Norton
First part of this day light breezes
and calm middle part light breezes
and pleasant saw two Whales of
some sort or other lowered and
Christ but did not see any more
of them. saw a few grampuses
in the forenoon latter part fresh
breezes and thick rainy weather
steering N. under all sail
Lat 38.12. Long 38.15

Sunday 13th of December 1839
First part of this Day a heavy gale of wind
from the S. E. and thick rainy Weather
Laying too under S. D. M. T. and main spraker
Middle part More moderate made sail steering
N. W. latter part clear weather saw a school
of porpoises and a grampus
