

High Wind of Green sent J. M. Case  
Tuesday 7th of January 1840

First part of this Day strong  
breezes from the N<sup>W</sup> & W heading  
W. S. Boat kept the N<sup>W</sup> Tapsail, All  
Hands Employed Boyling and Storing  
Down in the storages, saw one  
Whale, and 5 or 6 seals.  
Latter part of gale of wind and  
rain squalls, At 7, O'clock, boat down  
took in the Fore Sail, Lat by Obs 37.57

Wednesday 8th of January

This Day commences with fresh  
gales from the N<sup>W</sup> & W heading  
through, At Day light commence  
Saying, Middle and latter parts  
much the same saw several  
Whale but to rugged to lower  
for them, Lat by Obs 37.22  
Long by Chron 13.02

Thursday 9th of January 1840

Throughout this Day a gale of  
wind from the N<sup>W</sup> and clear  
weather At 10, Finish Saying

Friday 10th throughout this Day

gale of Wind from the N<sup>W</sup> &  
And Clear weather All hands  
Employed Storing down and  
Clearing Board saw 2 whales  
Lat by Obs 38.04 Long by Chron 11.08

Saturday 11th of January 1840

Throughout this Day a gale of  
wind from the N<sup>W</sup> & W  
Saying to under Mast R<sup>W</sup> &  
And all hands  
Lat by Obs 38.55 Long by Chron 11.34

Master Crewing in the S. Atlantic Ocean  
Sunday 12th of January 1840

Tristan  
All this day fresh breezes from  
the N<sup>W</sup> & W steering on the Wind  
to the N<sup>W</sup> saw several fin backs  
At 4 O'clock Dashed Ship stood  
to the N<sup>W</sup> At 7 O'clock Driston 250  
Bearing N<sup>W</sup> 77.55 miles Distance  
took in Sail Lat by Obs 37.50  
Long by Chronometer 10.54

Monday 13th of January

Throughout this Day strong gales  
from the N<sup>W</sup> & W Driston  
saw several fin backs, At 10  
took in Sail heading N<sup>W</sup> & W  
Cloudy Weather No Obs this Day

Tuesday 14th of January

All this Day fresh gales from  
the N<sup>W</sup> & W first part steering  
on the wind to the N<sup>W</sup> & E,  
under D R D, latter part W & E.  
Saw one or two fin backs  
At 7, O'clock took in Sail  
heading S<sup>W</sup> by W  
Lat by Obs 37.57 Long by Chron 10.35

Wednesday 15th of January 1840

Throughout this Day light breezes from  
the N<sup>W</sup> & W steering S<sup>W</sup> & E under All Sail  
pleasant weather, saw several fin backs  
but no W Whale, A very heavy swell  
running from the S<sup>W</sup>, At 6 past  
7 took in sail  
Lat by Obs 39.12  
Long by Chronometer 9.05 W
