 Sunday 9th of February 1840
 This Day commences with fresh gales
 from the N and clear weather
 Middle and latter part much the
 same

Monday 10th This Day commences
 with light breezes from the
 and pleasant weather latter part
 fresh gales from the south
 At 2 O'clock got under way and went
 out betwixt Robbins Island and the
 Maine Land, this day ends with light
 breezes from the SSW steering
 on the wind to the West

Tuesday 11th of February 1840
 Throughout this Day light breezes
 from the S W steering on the W
 and pleasant weather the latter
 employed on the rigging. saw 1 sail
 steering on the wind to the S S E
 Lat By Obs 33.42 Long By Chron 15.17

Wednesday 12th of February 1840
 Throughout this Day light breezes
 from the S W steering on the
 wind to the W. and clear pleasant
 weather. at 5 O'clock 10 Sailed Ship
 heading S by E. went about the N 2 points
 mended and bent it again
 Lat By Obs 34.04 Long By Chron 15.30

Thursday 13th of February 1840
 This day passes with fresh breezes from
 the W S W steering on the wind to the
 V clear weather D.R.T. saw nothing
 Lat By Obs 35.14 Long By Chron 15.30 East

Muste Bound Towards V. D. Island
 Friday 14th of February 1840
 Throughout this Day light
 breezes from the SSW steering on
 the wind to the W clear pleasant
 weather. the water employed
 mending sails &c. saw nothing
 At 5 O'clock 10 Sailed Ship heading
 S E. Lat By Obs 35.38.5
 Long By Chron 15.20 East

Saturday 15th of February 1840
 First part of this day light breezes and
 calm employed setting up rigging &c
 latter part fresh breezes from the
~~West~~ steering south. 1 sail in sight
 steering to the SSW clear weather
 Lat By Obs 36.20. Long By Chron 15.50

Sunday 16th of February 1840
 First part of this day fresh breezes
 from the W steering S S E saw two
 schools of Black fish, at Noon coast a
 very strong tide rip. latter part light
 breezes and calm clear pleasant
 weather. Lat By Obs 37.51. Long By Chron 16.00

Monday 17th of February 1840
 First part of this day fresh breezes from
 the S S E steering S S E Middle part wind
 more to the S. latter part from the
 W. and strong gales and squalls
 Saw one fin back, and a few porpoises
 At 8 O'clock took in the Main sail
 and Main Top Gallant sail
