breezes and pleasant. Saw plenty
birds but no whale. At 7 o'clock
took in sail heading to the N.

from the W. steering E. clear weather
middle and latter part more
moderate. Made all sail steering
E.S. clear weather. Saw two sails
of a steamer.

Throughout this day fresh breezes from
the E. W. and clear weather steering
E.S. under all sail two sails
in sight steering to the East
saw a school of porpoises caught
one.

Friday 13th of March 1840

First part of this day light breezes
from the S.W. steering E.S. and
pleasant weather. one sail in
sight, unbent and mended the S.R.
Spencer and bent it again sent
the fore & main yard right and unbent
the spencer.

Saturday 14th of March

Throughout this day fresh breezes from
the E. and squally. Steering on the
wind to the E.S. under D.R.

weather sailing to under S.R. No 3
and No 4 spencers heading E.S.

sail heading E.S.
