Thursday 26th of March 1840
Throughout this Day light breezes
from the S.W. steering E.S.E. under
all sail, good weather saw a
few porpoises. At 2 o'clock lost
sight of the Land or Island Amsterdam.

Long by Chron 78° 50' E

Friday 27th of March 1840
First part of this day fresh breezes
from the S.W. steering E by S middle
part took in foregallant sail and
D R kept the topsail latter part fresh
gales and squally took in the
jib and mainsail. Lost kept the
topsail.

At 2 o'clock Long by Lunar 81° 28'

Saturday 28th of March 1840
Throughout this Day fresh gales from
the S. steering E by S under D R
and cloudy weather saw several
schools of porpoise and blackfish.

Sunday 29th of March 1840
Throughout this Day fresh gales from
the S.S.E. and squally weather steering
on the wind to the E. under D R
Long by Lunar 86° 30' Lat by Obs 36° 18' South

Monday 30th of March 1840
First part of this Day fresh breezes
and squally middle part more
moderate turned the Rees out of the
topsail and set the Main Gallant sail
wind S.E.
Lat by Obs 35° 16' S
Long by Chron 88° 32' E

Tuesday 31st of March 1840
Throughout this Day light breezes and
squally weather wind from the
S.E. steering on the wind to the
E. under all sail Lat by Account 34° 50'
Long by Chron 90° 20'

All this Day light breezes from
the E.S.E. steering on the wind to
the South very pleasant weather
Saw nothing latter part employed
braking out for fresh water
and steering back salt water
in the lower hold, go a head

Thursday 2nd of April 1840
First part of this Day fresh breezes
from the E.S.E. steering on the
wind to the S.E. fair weather
latter part fresh gales from
the S.E. cloudy weather took in
foregallantsails and D R topsails

Friday 3rd of April 1840
Throughout this Day fresh gales
from the S. and squally weather
steering E by S. under D R
Lat by Obs 36° 21' S
