Saturday, 4th of April 1840

This Day commences with fresh
Gale and Thunder squalls from
the N.W. steering ESE... under
Close Reef Topsails. At Day Light
more moderate. turned the Reefs
out of the Topsails. Set the
Main Top Gallant Sail. At 11 O'clock
H.M. took a very heavy squall
from the N.W. took in sail
forward the Main Top Sail Luff
too. heading E. under Main Sperm
Only. Latter part of this Day very
heavy Gales from the N.W. at 12 past
6 P.M. set Close Reef M Topsail

Sunday, 5th of April 1840

This Day commences with fresh
Gales from the N.W. and clear
Weather. At 5 O'clock H.M. set the
Fore Sail and Fore Topmast Stay Sail
and hup off ESE. Middle part of
this Day more moderate turned
one Reef out of the Main Top sail
and set Close Reef Fore Top Sail
this Day Ends with fresh breeze
and cloudy Weather. Steering
ESE under Double Reef Topsails.
A very heavy swell running
from the N.W.

Latitude this Day by Observation
36.53 South

Longitude by Chronometer
97.44 East

Master Round for New Decland
Monday, 6th of April 1840

Throughout this Day Light breezes
from the N.W. steering SE by E
under 2d. pleasant Weather.
Sent Down Fore and Main Top
Gallant yards and Mast &c
saw nothing but a few porpoises

Tuesday, 7th of April 1840

First part of this Day light breezes
from the N.W. steering SE by E. clear
Weather. Latter part fresh breezes
and pleasant. Lat by Obs 38.04

Variation 14 Dec. W. by E.

Wednesday, 8th of April 1840

This Day commences with fresh Gale
and squally Weather. steering SE by E
under ESE. Middle and Latter part
wind more to the E. and clear weather

Thursday, 9th of April 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breezes from
the N.W. steering SE by E. and clear
Weather. untill the Main Top sail
mended it and but it again

And clear pleasant Weather. wind
from the N.W. steering SE by E.
