from the WSW steering ESE. Cloudy
Weather Middle part fresh Gales and
Squally DR the Topsails Latter part
much the same

Sunday 12th of April 1840

Throughout this Day Light breezes
from the WSW steering ESE
and Clear Weather. A very heavy
swell running from the SW
which makes the ship roll very
bad. Store the small boat
Took her in on Deck

Monday 13th of April 1840

First part of this Day Light breeze from
the SW steering ESE and rainy Weather
Latter part Clear and pleasant

Tuesday 14th of April 1840

First part of this Day fresh Gales from
the SW and squally Weather steering
ESE Middle and latter part Clear
and pleasant wind more from the
South

Wednesday 15th of April 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breezes
from the W steering ESE and
thick Cloudy Weather

Latt by Chron 42.50 S
Long by Chron 127.50 E

Thursday 16th of April 1840

First and Middle part of this Day
Light breezes from the SW steering
ESE and pleasant Weather broke
out some fresh water out of the
hole and stowed back salt water
Latter part Heavy Gales from
the WSW thick Weather DR the
Topsails

Friday 17th of April 1840

This Day commences with strong Gales
from the WSW steering ESE and
squally Weather Middle and latter
part wind more moderate and Clear
steering ESE under DR.

Saturday 18th of April 1840

First part of this Day, fresh Gales
from the W steering ESE under
DR, rainy squally Weather
Latter part Heavy Gales from the
SW and very heavy hail squalls
Took in fore and main Topsails
lost Rye the Main Topsail steering
E

Sunday 19th of April 1840

This Day commences with strong
Gales from the WSW and rainy
squally Weather, and ends with
heavy Gales from the WSW
and very squally steering
East under lost Rye Topsails
