First part of this Day fresh breezes
from the SSW at Day light made
SE, no ship steering on W, on a sea and
Latter part of this Day Light breezes
and clear Weather At sundown took in sail
were ship heading NE French Rock bearing
NW by N 10 miles Dis. Latt By Obs 31.40

Long By Chron 178.45 West

Thursday 28th of May 1840
First part of this Day Light breezes from
the SW middle part calm Latter a
light breeze from the NW 2 sails
in eight. Spoke the Tuscarora Co's
Spring 1300 lbs, saw a school of
black fish lowered and struck 3 saved
2. French Rock bearing W 25 miles
Dis. At 6 O'clock P.M. Latt By Obs 31.32

At 10 past 6 took in sail were ship
heading SSW wind from the NW 10
