the Tuscarora, thick rainy Weather
Latter part wind from the W wore Ship
heading to the N, At 5 O'clock spoke the
Tuscarora -
Lat By Obs. 31. 46 N
Long By Acc. 178. 40 W 31

Friday 29th of May 1840
This Day Commences with a Gail
of wind from the S W heading
NNE, Latter part more moderate
Made Sail D Ribs wore Ship steering
WSE, At 4 O'clock saw the French Rock
bearing N W, spoke the Tuscarora -
At 5 O'clock took in sail wore Ship
heading SE the Rock bearing N W
12 Miles Dis.,
Lat By Obs 31. 40
Long By Chron 178. 21 W 31

Saturday 30th of May 1840
First part of this Day light breezes
from the SE and very light rain
squalls, steering in for the rock
Middle part Calm, Latter part
a light breeze from the E, steering
SSW, at sundown the rock bearing
N 3 miles Dis., the Tuscarora in sight.
At 6 O'clock took in sail heading S.
Lat By Obs 31. 23
Long By Chron 178. 30 W 31

Sunday 31st of May 1840
Throughout this Day light winds
and pleasant weather steering in
for the rock, At 1 O'clock AM went
on shore fishing in company with
the Tuscarora, saw 2 sulphur bottom
sent for and main D Ribs a Left etc.

in the South Pacific Ocean for SO
Monday June 1st, 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breezes
from the NW, steering on the
wind to the SSE, in Company
with the Tuscarora, first part
clear weather latter part cloudy
misty and mended the mended
and bent it again Lat By Obs 32. 16
Long By Chron 177. 40

Tuesday June 2nd 1840
All this Day a Gail of wind from
the NW heading to the E under E Ribs
and fore sail, thick rainy Weather
Tuscarora in sight No Obs this
Day

Wednesday June 3rd 1840
Throughout this Day very light
breezes from the N, and clear
pleasant Weather employed at
mending sails, no saw nothing
of whale kind, Tuscarora in sight
spoke her - - - - -
Lat By Obs 33. 09
Long By Chron 176. 28

Thursday 4th of June 1840
All this Day light breezes from
the NW steering on the wind to
the NE in Company with the Tuscarora
Clear pleasant Weather saw nothing
rigid out flyjip boom Lat By Obs 33. 12
Long By Chron 176. 16 W 31

Friday 5th of June 1840. By Lunar 176 25 W
Throughout this Day light breezes from the W
steering NE, in Company with the Tuscarora
Saw nothing
