

Ship Triad of Green Port S M Case Master
Thursday 25th of June 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breezes
from the NW and Clear Weather
Steering SE by E under 8 or 7 in Company
with the Tuscarora. - Saw nothing
Look in sail Lat by Obs 25.37 S
Long by Chron 158.00 W

Friday 26th of June 1840

First part of this Day Light breezes from
the NW and pleasant Weather Steering
SE by N in Company with the Tuscarora
Later part wind more to the N. Steering
on the wind to SE. under all sail
Cloudy weather with some rain
Look in sail Lat by Obs 24.48 S
Long by Chron 152.03 W

Saturday 27th of June 1840

This Day Commences with fresh gales
from the NW and very squally rainy
Weather Sailing too under 8 or 7 and
Tuscarora. at 7 o'clock AM took a very
heavy squall split the Dore sail and
blew it clear of the yard and
lost the Main Top sail. Mid. and
later part more moderate wind out
one reef in the Main Top sail wind more
to the W heading N.W.W Tuscarora in
sight Look in sail Lat by Obs 24.40

Sunday 28th of June 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breezes from
the SE and Cloudy Weather most of
the time Steering N by E - Tuscarora in
sight. Saw a school of Killdeer
at 6 o'clock took in sail Left too
heading E.N.E. Lat by Obs 24.16 S
Long by Chron 150.30 W

Cruising in the South Pass for S.W. Whale
Monday 29th of June 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breezes
from the SE. and pleasant
Weather Steering N at 2 o'clock PM
made Lund Oblique Island bearing N.W. 30
Tuscarora in sight Lat by Obs 22.46 S
At 6 o'clock took in Long by Chron 150.46
Sail Left too under 8 or 7 and M.S. in
heading N.E the Island bearing N.W. 30
12 miles Dis This Island is in Lat 22.35
Long 150.55 W

Tuesday 30th of June 1840

This Day commences with fresh breezes
from the E.S.E. steering in for the
Lund At 10 o'clock AM run to the Leeward
of the Island and lay aback. A canoe came
along side or one boat went ashore in
company with the Tuscarora. At 3 o'clock
came on board again with about 300
Coconuts, bread fruit, plantains. This Day
End with fresh breeze from the N.E.
Steering off shore to the E.N.E under
8 or 7 topsails

Wednesday July the first 1840

This Day Commences with fresh breezes
from the E.S.E. At 3 o'clock AM were
Sailing Steering in for the Lund At
10 o'clock Two boats went on shore
in company with the Tuscarora and
landed on the East side of the Island
got the boats loaded with Coconuts
Sweet Potatoes. etc. etc. Returned on
board about 4 P.M. Took in sail
headed off shore to the N.E.
fresh gales and squally weather
Success to Chetirca Lat by Obs 22.27
