Thursday August 30th of 1840

First part of this Day fresh breezes from the W steering on the wind to the SSW then pleasant weather Middle part much the same Latter part wind more to the SW heading WSW under All Sail

Monday August Last 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breeze and squally weather steering on the wind SSW wind W at 5 O'clock took in Sail

Tuesday September 1st 1840

This Day Commences with light breezes from the NW made all sail steering on the wind WSW Middle part fresh breezes and squally, ruing took in fly jib and top gallant sail Latter part fresh Gales and Clear D.R.T. took in jib and Main sail at 6 O'clock took in sail Dams and Deck

Wednesday 2nd of September 1840

Throughout this Day fresh breezes from the NW and squally Got D.R.T. steering on the wind WSW saw several Fin Backs

At O'clock very squally too in sail

At 2 o'clock lost sight the Main Top sail and Foresail) Heavy squalls with lightning

Charter in the St. Ocean

Thursday 3d of September 1840

This day commences with heavy Gales from the W and squally at 5 o'clock wore ship heading NW

Latter part of this Day more moderate set the Fore sail, wore ship at 5 O'clock P.M. heading SSE

Friday 4th of September 1840

Throughout this day light breezes from the NW made all sail heading WSW

At 4 O'clock lade the Head yards Mast to stop a Leak in the lower

At 3 P.M. Moved forward again saw one Fin Back at 6 O'clock D.R. the S steering on the wind to the W

Saturday 5th of Sep 1840

This Day Commences with fresh breezes from the NW steering W by S at 10 O'clock saw 2 the top sail fresh Gales and Clear weather At 6 O'clock took in sail

Sunday 6th of Sep 1840

This day commences with light breezes and squally weather from the W as usual at 4 o'clock made sail 90°

at 1/2 past 8 took a squall blew away the jib or took in sail again

at 10 made sail 160° steering on the wind SW saw 2 ships the Thames and Tuscarora spoke the Tuscarora W. at 6 P.M. took another

squall Took in sail for the night No Obs this Day
