Tuesday 8th of Sep 1840
All this Day fresh breezes from
the S. Steering W. Clear Weather
Saw too Fin Bucks. Three Ships in
sight Spoke the Columbia
Sag Harbor - and Luscora
at Sun Down Took in Sail —

Long By Chron 165-50 W

Wednesday 9th of Sep 1840
All this Day Light breezes
from the S.W. Steering as the
wind to the N.W. in Company
with the Luscora Thames and
Columbia. Saw one or two
Fin Bucks At Sun set Took in
Sail Latt By Obs 33-03 S

Thursday 10th of Sep 1840
All this Day fresh breezes from
the W.S.W. and pleasant weather
Steering on the wind to the S
Saw several Fin Bucks and Porpoises
the Luscora Thames and Columbia in
sight at Noon At 6 O'clock took in
Sail heading S by W

Latt By Obs 33-20 S
Long By Chron 166-28 W

Ship Dried of Green Port

Friday 11th of Sep 1840
First part of this Day Light
breezes from the S.W. Steering
on the wind to the S. Weather
and latter part Clear and
Clear Weather Saw nothing
except 3 Ships to the North
of us, Took in sail Latt By Obs 33-44 S
Long By Chron 166-15 W

Saturday 12th of Sep 1840
All this Day Light breezes from
the S. Steering W. pleasant
Weather Three Ships in sight
Steering the same Way Saw
Nothing at 6 O'clock Took in the S

Latt By Obs 33-40 S

Sunday 13th
All this Day fresh breezes from
the S.W. Steering S.W. pleasant
Weather Saw a great many
Fin Bucks but nothing more
At 6 O'clock took in sail C.R.M.
Left too heading W by N

Latt By Obs 33-50 S

Monday 14th
First part of this Day fresh
breezes from the W.S. Steering
S.W. under D.R.Z. Latter
part fresh Gale and Cloudy
Weather at 1 O'clock Took
in sail Left too heading S.W.
Saw a Harem Whales head
but too Rugged to do any thing
with it. Saw some Kelp
This Day Ends with heavy Gale
from the N.E. and Cloudy
Weather
