

Tuesday 22nd of September 1840
All this Day Light breezes from
the N.E. and pleasant Weather
Steering to the E. Saw two Ships
and one Pin-back and a few Porpoises
at sun set took in sail heading E.
Lat by Obs 33.25 S
Long by Chron 172.30 W
by Lunar 172.20 W

Wednesday 23rd of Sep 1840
All this Day fresh breezes from
the S.E. and clear Weather first
part steering on the wind to the
E. Latter part North saw two
Pin Backs and one Ship steering
the same way. Took in sail.
Lat by Obs 33.20 S
Long by Chron 171.41 W

Thursday 24th of Sep 1840
First part of this Day fresh breezes and
clear Weather steering N saw a school
of Blackfish Latter part much the
same steering N.W. wind S.E.
Saw 2 Ships & a Bayling spoke
the Ann Maria New London
1800 Bbl. at sun set took in sail
Left too heading S.W. Lat by Obs 32.40 S
Long by Chron 171.40 W

Friday 25th of Sep 1840
All this Day Light breezes from
the S.E. steering to the N. saw
nothing except 2 Ships spoke the
Brance say Harbor and Washington
nothing this season at sun set
took in sail heading N. wind more
to the E. and N.E. Lat by Obs 32.16 S
Long by Chron 172.20 W

Saturday 26th of Sep 1840
All this Day fresh breezes from
the N.W. first part steering on
the wind to the N.W. Latter part
S.W. in Company with the Brance
and Washington saw one more
Ship and 1 Pin-back. Took in sail
Lat by Obs 31.35 S

Sunday 27th of Sep 1840
All this Day fresh breezes from the
N. and pleasant Weather steering S.W.
and S and S.E. three Ships in sight
saw several Pin Backs took in sail
heading E. no Obs this Day

Monday 28th of Sep 1840
First part of this Day calm
and rainy Weather Latter part
clear Weather and a Light breeze
from the S steering on the wind
E.S.E. 2 Ships in sight saw one
Pin-back at sun set took in sail
Lat by Obs 33.00 S
Long by Chron 173.00 W

Tuesday 29th of September 1840
All this Day Light breezes from
the W.S.W. steering on the wind
to the S. saw several Pin Backs
and 3 or 4 Ships spoke ship Thames
say Harbor one Whale, 1 Misarora
one Whale took in sail heading S.W.
Lat by Obs 33.38 S

Wednesday 30th
All this Day Light breezes from the
W. first part steering on the wind
to the N. Latter part S.E. spoke the
Washington Harbor. 5 ships in sight
saw some Black fish Lat by Obs 33.20 S
Long by Chron 172.26 W
