

Wednesday 2th of Nov 1840
 First part of this Day fresh Gale from
 the N steering ENE and pleasant
 Weather saw one ship steering SE
 Latter part much the same Weather
 Steering SE, saw one Bark in no whale
 At 12 past 6 P.M. D.R. the D.R. sails
 Steering SE. Lat by Obs 34.18 S
 Long by Chron 170.18 W

Thursday 3th of Nov 1840
 All this Day fresh breezes from
 the N first part steering SE
 Middle part SE, Latter part E and
 SE, saw 2 ships, and one whale
 Christ him in company with the
 Caledonia, Bouts of New London
 did not get hold of him the C had
 10 whale this season, at 1 o'clock
 took in sail left too heading SE
 Lat by Obs 34.30 S
 Long by Chron 168.47 W

Friday 4th of November 1840
 First part of this Day fresh Gale
 from the N made sail D.R. steering
 NE, at 1 o'clock saw several W. whale
 to rugged to lower, at 2 P.M. took a
 very squall with some thunder
 and lightning and the Day ends
 with very strong winds from the west
 Laying too under C.A.M.D. Spencer &
 3 ships in sight (Heading NW)

Ship Trial of Greenport West

Saturday 5th of November 1840
 All this Day fresh Gale from
 the N.W. heading SE
 Clear Weather saw several
 W. whale and two ships
 Laying too under C.A.M.D. Lat by Obs 34.11
 Long by Chron 167.14

Sunday 6th of Nov 1840
 All this Day very heavy Gale from
 the N.W. and squally Weather
 Laying too under short R.M. D.R. sail
 and M. Spencer one sail in sight
 Heading N, saw one whale
 Lat by Obs 34.35 S
 Long by Chron 166.51 W

Monday 7th of Nov 1840
 First part of this Day fresh Gale
 from the N.W. at 8 o'clock M.D.
 made sail D.R. heading S. saw
 several W. whale lowered 29 but
 very rugged got nothing & ships
 in sight at 12 past 9 took in
 sail heading S Lat by Obs 34.27
 Long by Chron 165.37

Tuesday 10th of Nov 1840
 First part of this Day fresh breezes
 from the N.W. and clear Weather
 6 ships in sight. Latter part wind
 more moderate with light rain
 squalls saw plenty of W. whale
 lowered 3 times but rugged Weather
 and whale will get nothing
 saw 3 of the ships take a whale
 at 1 o'clock P.M. give up pursuing
 came on board took in sail for
 the night heading N
