All this Day Light breezes from
the S. W. and clear weather
Saw two Whales at 8 o'clock AM
Got one but him in started
Dry works saw 9 Ship One Boyling
Spoke the Thomas Dickerson
Saw Harbor 14 Whales this season
in company with the Skiptone
Got 4 basks of bread of the Skiptone
Saw the Prance Harbor 8 Whales
and the Calidonia 16 Whales

Latt by Obs 34. 02 S
Long by Acc 158. 10 W

Thursday 12th of Nov 1840
All this Day Light breezes from
the S. and pleasant weather
saw 2 Whales & more 6 Ship in
sight Lowered ~~one~~ and hoisted got
nothing saw the Thomas Dickerson
take over, spoke the Prance
the watch employed Boyling
At 7 o'clock took in sail

Long by Chron 159. 30 W

Friday 13th of Nov 1840
First part of this Day calm
and pleasant all hands employed
stowing down and cleaning down
latter part Light breezes from
the S. steering on the wind E. S. E.
seven sails in sight 2 aboyling
saw 2 Whales struck one drew
from him at 1/2 past 3 took in sail
heading E. S. E.

Long by Acc. 165. 02 W

Master hunting for Whales in the S. E.
Saturday 14th of Nov 1840

All this Day Light breezes from
the E. and pleasant weather
Saw plenty of Whales struck
and killed 2 saved 1 sunk 1
5 ships in sight they got nothing
at sun set took in sail heading
S. E.

Latt by Obs 33. 50 S
Long by Chron 164. 50 W

Sunday 15th of Nov 1840
All this Day fresh breezes from
the E. S. E. and cloudy weather saw
4 or 5 Whales lowered 3 times hoisted
started twice Whales very wild
Got nothing 5 ships in sight
Saw the Skiptone got on at
sun set took in sail Latt by Obs 33
the watch employed Boyling Long by Acc. 165. 00

Monday 16th of Nov 1840
Throughout this Day fresh breezes
from the E. S. E. and cloudy weather
Weather stowed down 65 tons of Oil
Saw a few Whales lowered 1
got nothing 5 ships in sight
2 a boyling & 300 Latt by Obs 33. 58 S
looking sail heading S. E. Long by Chron 164. 58 W

Tuesday 17th of Nov 1840
All this Day fresh gales from
the N. E. and cloudy kind of weather
Saw 4 Whales to the wind and
and 4 ships steering on the
wind E. S. E. under D. R. B. at night
took in sail
