

Friday 27th of Nov 1840

All this Day Light breezes from the N and pleasant weather saw plenty of whale but very wild. Landed 8 times at 6 o'clock. Took one and took him along side took in sail for the night 4 ships in sight all boiling spoke ship Triton & Warren 16 whale.

Saturday 28th of Nov 1840

First part of this Day Light breezes from the NE and good weather. Cut in the whale. Latter fresh breezes and blowy saw 3 whale got one put him in quartered dry works. 3 ships in sight.

Sunday 29th of Nov 1840

This day commences with fresh breezes from the ESE and rainy squally weather employed boiling. Latter part heavy gales and squally rainy weather.

Monday 30th of Nov 1840

All this Day fresh breezes from the NW and foggy rainy weather. Employed boiling. Saw 4 whale. Landed twice did not get rest. at midnight finish trying.

Tuesday December 1st of 1840

All this Day fresh breezes from the N and clear weather. Saw 2 whale to the windward and 2 ship. All the Day storm blowing. Spoke the Franklin Bay Harbor 10 whale this season.

Wednesday 2nd of Dec 1840

All this Day light breezes from the NW steering SE in company with the Franklin saw no whale. At 7 o'clock L. & the day's work. Lat by Obs 37.00 S
Long by Chron 160.55 W

Thursday 3rd of Dec 1840

All this Day fresh breezes from the SE steering to the E rainy weather. Saw 2 or 3 sun backs 1 ship in sight. Lat by Obs 37.00 S

Friday 4th of December 1840

All this Day light breezes from the NW and clear weather. Saw one carke and one ship first caught him, one ship in sight at sun set. Lat by Obs 37.44 S

Long by Chron 160.18 W

Saturday 5th of December 1840

All this Day fresh breezes from the NW steering E, one ship in sight to the leeward. Saw 1 fair bark at sun set took in sail heading E.
