

Sunday July 11th 1847 born with light breezes from
the South steering E N E
at 7 PM shortened sail. saw two whales going as if they
were sent for. Made all sail at 3 AM as usual
Heading to the S wind being to the E. Letter
port struck & drewed from a whale to the W B
Ditto at another to the B B wind account

Monday July 12th born with moderate breezes
from NW blowing whales with out success
shortened sail at sundown made sail at
6 AM Letter port blowing whales in vain
saw two ships one cutting to land later

Tuesday July 13th born with fresh breezes
NW steering by the wind. Sawed & struck a whale
if I may so say they we shall get him. My saying
has proved true. although it looked dark when
I wrote the former part of the work look
Horn along side Letter port cutting. Lat 56.50
Long 138.20

Wednesday July 14th fresh breezes & fair weather
at 5 PM struck a whale
& lost three lines Letter port Bailing &
boring near night did not get a chance to catch him

Thursday July 16th born with light breezes
& making preparations
for stowing down. At 1 PM started
north the lat off deck struck & took a
notter. whales landed out him in
a good days work

Thick weather could not do
Observations

Sunday July 18th 1847 Seen Feb 8th 1874 Snow 19th Deep
born with light breezes from S
Chad whales several times these first part of these 24 hours
without success being the still could not get near enough
to fasten. B B cut twice but did not get fast
Employed Bailing &c. Lat 57.30 - 137.00

Tuesday July 20th born with light breezes from the
South Employed stowing down. Lat
Middle & Letter ports thick fog steering to the W
saw no whales for several days. Lat 56.30
Long 137.20

Wednesday July 21st born with light breezes from
the Westward steering to the N
spoke ship Thorpe West of Hibernia 30 months out with
3000 lbs M.W. & Letter ports fresh because saw when
born without success

Friday July 23rd born with fresh breezes from
the West Letter port seen struck
a whale to the S B B star slightly. Lat
in thick fog. Lat 56.30 had lost sight of
the ship. Several hours finally got to him dead
and raised the ship & good luck would have
it. Saw account Letter port strong breezes from
the West Corn cutting but found it to
knapp so gave it up and took a watch
allowe left hands Lat 55.21
Long 138.00

Saturday July 24th born with fresh breezes from
the West. Put down our whale spoke ship
Macon of NB 22 Mo. old with 3000 lbs working
one whale more to full Middle & Letter ports Bailing
Lat 54.46
Long =

69 South, It.
