

Remarks On Board Ship Trident On the NW Coast
Monday July 26th born with fresh breezes from the West -
Truck & sank a whale to the B.T.B. Employed
Sailing &c. Middle port Sailing. Latter part saw whales
struck two to get them to the shore from 1 & 2 miles
from the other so ends the day. Lat 53° 42'

Tuesday July 27th born with light breezes from the W
Lowered for Whales first part with
out success. Latter part struck & sank one. W.B. Employed
stowing down the foretack.

Wednesday July 28th light breezes from the W with
some fog. At 6 P.M. struck
a whale & took them along side W.B. Latter part cutting
down 2 sails. Lat 54° 16'

Monday August 2nd 1847 Since I last wrote in this
we have taken one. Blasted
whale. Boiled him & the other & stowed them down
today also spoke by E. Donal & Whales. The latter
part of the day we were a searching for whales
whales small every day for some ten days. Latter part
from the lat of 50° to 53° & Long 137° 30' West of
Ships in sight all the time part of their sails & rigging
black but plenty of white. Last coast
get near them in Lat 54° 04' Long 138° 31'.

Thursday Aug 3rd first part struck in lowered for
without success. Employed a Sailing
Q. B. Middle & latter parts foggy saw ship, Esquimaux
of Warren R.I. so ends Lat 53° 42'

Friday Aug 4th light breezes with much fog. Sailed
saw & chased whales latter part went out & saw
spoke & grappled with ship, Waverly of N.B. Lat 54° 26'
Tuesday Aug 15th hauled around struck & raised Long 138° 04'
from a whale to the S. Boat - so no good

Thursday Aug 26th these 24 hours calm with a heavy swell
employed minding sails. This day on the
tack had a gale from E.S. now trying to get to the South
Lat 47° 10' -
Long about 144° 50'

Friday Aug 29th fine breezes from the NW 24 hours
steering S.E. I cannot better to quote Church today
would that I was on the old Tarnard to compare a few of
these Lewis houses as we are in about the same Lat 48° 40' -
