 Wednesday, September 1st 1847 Light breeze from the
 NW. These 24 hours with
 some rain. Employed Working Ship & Steering etc.
 Lat. 36-45. Long 142-10.
 Sunday Sept 3rd Fresh N.E. Trades these 24 hours back
 Ham in 35. a smashing breeze
 Huddling sails cut ahead & left Steering etc. Kitting north
 of remark letter place moving sea on cables now sails
 Employed repairing sails. feel rather lonesome this evening
 with I was in the place that I was no year since last
 I suppose it will be years before I shall realize this visit
 if ever God allows doing the good will to do & Lat. 37-30
 Long 147-39
 Thursday Sept 9th Light breeze & fair weather this
 week. Employed about various ship duties during
 from 10 to 12. Long we are in the Lat. 38-11 N
 & Long 141-40 West
 Wednesday Sept 15th Moderate breeze from West E
 should take them for the B. Trades - saw Black Fish
 for a few days just had calm sailing weather Steady
 by the wind to the S.W. got a Lancer etc Lat 39-10 N
 Long 141-54
 Friday Sept 17th First part of these 24 hours hazy, wind
 with much rain. Middle & latter part fresh breeze from
 the South Steady by the wind took & took Lat 40-13
 Would that I were where I was a year ago Long 139-48
 Had had seen to see Anna for the last time while long
 Friday Sept 24th 1847 Fresh S.E. Trades these 24 hours steady
 & by the. One gear today since Anna was transferred to her
 narrow home I never would another such a days work as that
 so it being my prospect watch below I will see if I might

 Monday Sept 27th 1847 Fresh breeze from N.E. these
 24 hours Steady S.W. Lat 41-10 N
 Latter part with Employed sewing & some other work
 being rather. I suppose this 5 years Lat 41-10 N
 Long 141-10 West
 Wednesday Sept 29th Strong Trades with Squalls of
 rain these 24 hours Steady S.W. Lat 41-10 N
 Latter part double reefed the topmast. Sent up the
 fore topmast & topmast mast yesterday set up the
 rigging &c Lat 41-10 N
 Long 141-10 West
 Sunday Oct 3rd 1847 Fresh breeze from the S.E. these 24
 hours Middle part - Shortened sail & then a back the main
 sail. Latter part Steady by the wind to the S.W. Lat 41-50 S
 Long 142-05 West
 Tuesday Oct 5th Fresh breeze from the S.E. - these 24 hours first
 & latter part Steady by the wind to the S.W. Middle
 part Shortened sail & some ship several times. Latter part
 the main yard a back three hours looking for land
 I believe - in the Lat 41-54 South
 Long 145-30 West
 Wednesday Oct 11th 1847 Fine breeze from the S.E. these 24 hours at 2
 P.M. Main. Steady. Island at 4 P.M. sent two
 Boats in but no current land. Came aboard &
 Kept off for Whytoata. Latter part kept ashore
 Trading Saturday & Sunday & some Lat 41-56
 Long 149-45
 Monday Oct 11th Spoke Ship. Brothers N.E. bound from
 wanting one thousand lbs. Latter part
 Made the Island of Rotonga going off & some more
 day. Tuesday Oct 12th Strong breeze from S.E.
 these 24 hours Steady by the wind and
 started to see a store but gave it up for a
 had got ham on board & some Tacks
