Remarks on board Monday September 25th

Moderate winds from the South all this day
beating to windward under all sail to work about the
Ship's course so ends this day

Lat 26° 09' N. Long 151° 34' W.

Remarks on board Tuesday Sept 26th

Moderate winds from the S.W. all
this day steering to the N.W. sharp on the wind
letter part washing ship outside &c -
so ends this day

Lat 25° 24' N. Long 152° 08'

Remarks on board Wednesday Sept 27th

Strong winds from the S.W. I must
all these 24 hours steering to the S. employed
washing & painting ship, calculated to have commenced
coopering this morning but the weather would not let
us as good luck would have it, we have four men on the
deck his some with the saws, get the old fore
mast on the main again, so ends this day

Lat 23° 57' N. Long 153° 33' W

Thursday Sept 28th

Moderate winds from the S. all
this day steering N.W. employed about various
duties. so ends this 24 hours

Lat 21° 58' N. Long 155° 10' W

Saturday Sept 30th

Clear weather & fair weather
steering N.W. found Calypso
this morning 10 miles distant. At 4 P.M. passed
the North point got the anchors off the bows
middle & letter parts light and calm working to the
South. Saw a Sheep - so ends this day

Lat 17° 56' N. Long 165° 58' W

From the Kure Islands Towards the Sandwich Islands. Dec 848

Remarks on board Tuesday October 3rd 1848

Commenced with small winds
from the N.W. kept labor ashore, middle part steering
to the Southward, letter part kept anchor in 10 fathoms
10 fathoms of water so ends this day At Anchor

Remarks on board Wednesday Oct 4th 1848

Very warm weather commenced coopering
what little Garry we have sent seven men ashore
to get the shavings out of them. Letter part employed
coopering, so ends At Anchor

Remarks on board Friday Oct 6th 1848

Warm weather all this day
finished coopering at 4 P.M. Bob & his
middle part no remarks, Letter part - labor
work on deck. Letter part washing ship &c
so ends this day At Anchor

Remarks on board Monday Oct 9th 1848

Small winds & fair weather all
this day first part five men despatched while on
liberty, Mr. Walcott pastured, also letter part
employed painting ship &c so ends this day At Anchor

Remarks on board Wednesday Oct 11th

Light winds from the Westward most part of this
day - labor work on liberty started with employed
about various duties, so ends this day
