Remarks Thursday October 25th 1849

Moderate Easterly winds & fair weather these 24 hours Steering to the Southward under all sail employed about various ships & boats about 10 miles in sight. So ends this day
Lat 26° 18' N. Long 153° 30' W

Remarks on board Saturday Oct 27th

Brisk Trades & fair weather these 24 hours Steering to the South employed about various duties. So ends this day
Lat 26° 49' N. Long 154° 55'

Remarks on board Sunday Oct 28th

Moderate Trades & fair weather first part Steering due West. Saw Corypheus & Pagrus not mistakable part. Laying about, then part Steering to the Westward saw some fine miles distant. So ends this day

Remarks on board Monday Oct 29th 1849

These 24 hours commenced with strong N.E. trades & rainy weather. At 6 PM came to anchor in the line boats. Meeting 40 ships here after we had looked the sick. I went on board of the King to see if I could get some news from my long lost & too dear friends. 26 long months have rolled away since I have heard a word from home I may say. When I arrived about of the 11 my first inquiry was letters but was not much disappointed in not finding any for such has been the fruits of my fruitless inquiries. No long to hear them much although I shed no tears yet it is within this faithful bosom where all my tears are shed you tears of blood assuming by

Remarks on board Ship Monticello of Sant

Friday November 27th 1849

These 24 hours commenced with light winds & fair weather at 2 PM weighed anchor and Steered towards Pohna bound part on the way at 4 PM came to anchor outside the bar latter part a boat crew on shore with Capt Folger & myself. I found one letter from my dear departed father written Oct 27th 49. Oh how sad it makes me feel to think that that dear father is no more for this world. So ends this day
at anchor

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 28th

These 24 hours we have fresh Trades & rainy weather but came off at sunset went ashore with Mr Nelson. So ends this day
at anchor

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 29th

First part of these 24 hours we have fresh Trades & fair weather at 4 PM weighed anchor and commenced our homeward journey misty & latter part Steering to the S.W. So ends this day

Remarks Friday Nov 30th

Fresh Trades & fair weather these 24 hours Steering to the S.W. and a sail So ends this day
