last parts strong gales from the SW
Lat 45.28

Monday Feb 10th Commences with
strong gales from the SW with squalls
and a large sea running ship steering N
sent up main royal yard saw a ship
steering N by W middle and last parts
the same Lat 42.55
Long 78.00

Tuesday Feb 11th Commences with
strong breezes from the South ship
steering N by E Lat 40.40
Long 76.40

Wednesday Feb 12th Commences
with strong breezes from the SSE and
overcast ship steering N by E last part
ship steering N by E at 10 made the Gulf
Islands bearing East found the Chronometer
25 miles to far ~~East~~ West

Thursday Feb 13th Commences
with strong breezes from the South
at 4 PM went on shore and got
some fresh beef at 8 bore up for
Palmarazo last part calm and foggy

weather saw sperm whales struck one
and iron strap parted have seen sperm
whales three times in 5 days have always
seen them 15 or 20 miles from the land
at 10

strong breezes from the South and clear
weather stood in to St Marie to look
for deserters did not find them kept way
for Juan Fernandez
