

Remarks On Board Monday May 12/54
All these 24 hours brisk breeze from
the NW and fine weather spoke the
ship Brighton of New Bedford saw
2 other ships saw right whales lowered
without success Lat 57. 21

Thursday May 15 the last 3 days brisk
breezes from the NW and good
weather saw very few whales and all day
with this day made the land Mount
Kronotska at 4 PM took light breeze
from the SW ship steering NE

Friday May 16 Commences with light
variable winds ship's course NE
saw scattering whales all very wild
Lat 57. 36
Long 163. 49

Saturday May 17 light air from SE
and overcast ship steering NE at
6 PM saw ice ahead dist. 6 miles
hauled by the wind heading E by N
Lat 58. 00
Long 164. 45

Monday May 19 brisk breezes from the
SE hauled round to East and breezes
on with some rain at 10 PM hove too
under close reefed main topsail last
part strong gale with considerable snow
Lat by act 56. 30
Long " " 168. 40

Tuesday May 20th
and rain made strong breeze with snow
same sail

Wednesday May 21
with brisk breezes from SE and foggy
last part more moderate wind at 10 PM
Lat 56. 03
Long 166. 12

Thursday May 22 Calm and light breezes
with thick weather Lat 56. 00
Long 167. 20

Friday May 23 the first part light
breezes from the SE and overcast
at 10 AM lowered the boats for a
right whale did not strike saw
an iron in him last part
strong gale and raining let in
fuel & shizen topsails
no obs suppose the Lat 57. 00
Long 169. 15

Saturday May 24 brisk breezes from
the South and overcast ship steering
NE struck a right whale and
hauled Lat 57. 27
Long 170. 40

Sunday May 25 the first part light
breezes from the SE with some snow &
rain ship steering NE saw one right
whale going south quick last part light
breezes from the SW and some fog
Lat 59. 00
Long 172. 20
