

Thursday Feb^y 12, 1852
moderate gales from the ESE and
good weather at 8 AM tacked ship
to the SE last part wind bearing
in reefed top sails and tacked ship at 10 PM.

Friday Feb^y 13, 1852
The first part heavy
breeze from the ESE and clear weather
close. reefed the top sails at 2 AM more
ship at 5 AM found a large fishing
boat whilst reefing the main top sail
+ carried away some of our marlinzels
gear. damage to the boat unknown.
at 7 the land about 5 miles distant.
tacked ship and set reefed main sail

Saturday Feb^y 14
The first part strong
gales from the ESE at 3 PM was
within about 5 miles of the land.
tacked ship to the Southward found
some copper gorse from the bears
supposed to have been knocked off by
the contact with the fishing boat

Sunday Feb^y 15
The first part calm
last part strong gales from ESE
saw a whale ship under gary fore top
mast steering W by N showing white signal
with red border and H in center saw
a barge at same time steering same
course at 5.30 PM were ship and close
reefed the fore top sail heading North

Monday Feb^y 16
The first part strong
gales from ESE at 3 AM were ship
to the SE more ship again at 4 PM
heading SE by W to ESE at 6 AM in
the main sail and close reefed the top sails

Tuesday Feb^y 17
strong gales from the
ESE and overcast ship under close
reefed top sails with courses in at 8
AM were ship to the SE and set the
fore sail

Wednesday Feb^y 18
Strong breeze
from the East and good weather at
at 4 PM tacked ship close to the
land to the SE

Thursday Feb^y 19
The first part
strong breeze from ESE last part
light winds at 4.30 tacked ship near
the land to the ESE

Friday Feb^y 20 strong breeze from
the ESE and overcast ship heading ESE
tacked ship at 7 AM and at noon

Saturday Feb^y 21 Strong gales from
SE by E and overcast ship heading SE
under close reefed top sails and courses

supposed lat at noon 21.5
