The first part strong breeze from the South and hazy last part heavy gale passed through the various straits saw ice about 25 miles S.W. by S. from the passage

May 4th brisk breeze from the East steered along the ice to the West and found it very plenty

May 5th the first part thick fog last part heavy gale from the W

May 6th brisk breeze from the West steered along the ice to the Eastward

Friday May 7th

The first part brisk breeze from W last part baffling winds and calms tried to get out of the sea found so much current in the passage gave it up and worked back again saw one ship

Saturday May 8th

light baffling winds and calm the ship lying about between Round Island and Company's Land

Sunday May 9th

strong gale from South with rain last part wind hauled to W and cleared off from that to S.W. and moderated

Monday May 10th strong breeze from the S.W. and good weather

Tuesday May 11th

The first part light and changeable winds last part brisk breeze from the S.W. at 8 P.M. hove to for the night near Round Island

Wednesday May 12th

light and variable winds saw 2 large whales hove to for them without success Round Island bearing E.S.E. dist 12 miles last part rainy ship steering S.E. saw ice ahead hauled on the wind heading S.W. by W took in top gal & sails and by

Thursday May 13th

The first part strong breeze from the East with fog and rain at 5 A.M. passed through between Round Island and the Company's Land steering East at 10 the fog cleared off spoke the Phoenix and Wm. Thompson

Friday May 14th

The first part light breeze from the East and hazy last part strong breeze from the South and thick weather passed through the Straits of Chalesha in company with the Phoenix of C^{pt} Bedford saw the Wm. Thompson come through steered S.W. 40 miles and by two all right

Saturday May 15th

brisk breeze from the W.S.W. and most of the time foggy thermometer at 30 saw a small lot of ice
