

1859 Jan 3^d Saw a whale at midnight
Lat 48. 00 Long 160. 45

Jan 6th Spoke the Eliza. J. Masan
nothing since leaving the Islands.
Lat 46. 50 Long 157. 45

Jan 7th Put away for Cape Horn

Jan 28th Passed Cape Horn
Saw two merchant ships bound West

Jan 31st Saw and passed the Falkland Islands

Feb 7th Saw plenty of Sperm whales.
got one and saw the Navy get one
Lat 46. 40 Long 66. 30

March 1st A very heavy gale commenced blowing
heavily at 8th and howled round
gradually to SW the heaviest part
lasted about twelve hours. the barometer
at 28. 85

Lat about 54. 00
Long 10. 40 W

at 8. 30 A.M. blew away the main top
sail. at about 5 P.M. shipped a
heavy sea and Robert C. Baxter was
washed over board and was never seen
afterwards

three boats were lost together and
the ship badly stove carrying away
three davits, a large portion of the
bulwarks and a number of loose
things off deck

carried away the main top mast stay
main top sail brace bolt and girt
main top gale and started the ship to leaking

April 1st 1859 Saw Cape St Augustene bearing N by W
Dist 60 miles

May 1st Spoke the ship. Not reunion of and for
Boston 104 days from Calcutta
Lat 31 35 North Long 67. 05 West
her Long one degree farther west
