

Bound to the Indian Ocean. - 1838

20 mi. Dis. set the J. Sails, and J. Sail, and Steered to the S. by E. at 7 P.
saw many Albatrosses, latter part Strong winds and thick weather
attended with rain, at dawn the S. Part of St. Jago bore S.W.
14 mi. Dis. so ends the Day -

Thursday
Oct. 18th.

Commenced with Strong Gales from the E. thick and rainy at 8 P.
M. Double reefed the J. Sails, at 2 P.M. hove to under a close reefed
M. J. Sail and Staysails, Port Bree bearing N.E. 4 P.M. Dis.
at 10 P.M. more Ship, at Mid night began to moderate, at 4 Am.
set the J. Sail, and Mizzen J. Sail, at Daylight made all Sail,
at 10 Port Bree bore S.E. 3 mi Dis. Capt. P. went on shore so ends
the 24 hours clear and fine weather

Friday
Oct. 19th.

Commenced with Brisk winds from the E. and Pleasant
a number of Portugues along side with Oranges Coconuts
&c. for tender, at 2 P.M. the Boat came on board with fruit
Fowls, and Hys, at 3 P.M. went on shore again, at 1/2 past 5 P.M.
Capt. P. returned on board, Steered to the S. by E. at 1/2 past 8
took in the J. G. Sails, at 9 P.M. took in the Jib, and Spanker
hauled up the Courses and Clewed down the J. Sails, heavy
squalls, & Calms, attended with thunder and rain at 11 P.M. set
the J. Sails Single reefed, Courses, and Jib, at Daylight made
all Sail, latter part light winds and hazy so ends the Day

Saturday

Oct. 20th.

Lat. 13° 34' N. Long. 22° 54' W.
First and Middle part light winds from the E. Steering to
the S. by E. at 3 Am. set the Stiding sails, at 7 P.M. sent up
the main Royal yard so ends these 24 hours.

Sunday

Oct. 21st.

Lat. 12° 13' N. Long. 22° 21' W.
Commenced with light airs from the E. S. E. and hazy, Stee-
ring to the S. by E. at 8 P.M. the main hauled to the E. by E.
took in the Stiding sails latter part light winds from the E. E.
and clear so ends these 24 hours.

Monday

Oct. 22nd.

Lat. 11° 41' N. Long. 21° 54' W.
All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward
and hazy, Steering to the S. by E. latter part employed
in getting Fore & Mizzen Royal yards Altered Altered.

Tuesday

Oct. 23rd.

Lat. 10° 34' N. Long. 21° 15' W.
Commenced with light winds from the E. E. and fine weather

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At 3 P.M. set the lower Stiding sail, Middle part Cloudy, with
lightning, with winds from S. by W. latter part hazy
so ends these 24 hours. Steering S. by E.

Wednesday
Oct. 24th.

Lat. 9° 39' N. Long. 20° 48' W.
Commenced with winds from S. S. W. and hazy, Middle
part light variable winds and Calm's Thunder attended with
rain, took in the Stiding sails Royals, & J. G. Sails, latter part
winds from the South-westward, thick and squally, S. obs.

Thursday

Oct. 25th.

Lat. by Reck. 8° 09' N. Long. 20° 33' W.
First part light airs from the S. W. and rainy, Steering to the
Southward by the wind, at 4 P.M. Calm, at 8 P.M. took a light breeze
from the S. by W. Middle part Cloudy, latter part Clear and
pleasant so ends employed on the Rigging

Friday

Oct. 26th.

Lat. 8° 56' N. Long. 19° 45' W.
First part light winds from the S. W. and pleasant Steering to
the Southward by the wind, Middle and latter part Calm, so
ends these 24 hours Lat. 8° 54' N. Long. 19° 10' W.

Saturday

Oct. 27th.

Commenced with light winds from the S. W. by S. Steering to
the S. S. W. at 2 P.M. set in thick and squally, took in the Stu-
ding sails and Royals, the Remainder of the Day winds from
S. to W. and rainy, so ends. S. obs. Lat. 8° 26' N. Long. 19° 01' W.

Sunday

Oct. 28th.

First part light variable winds and Calms, attended with squalls of rain, at 4 P.
M. spoke a French Whale Brig from Bath Bound to the South, Middle part
Thunder and rain from all quarters, made and took in Sail a number of
times, at 6 Am. the rain cleared of, made all Sail, latter part light winds
from S. S. W. Steering to the Southward by the wind a number of
Sail in sight Lat. by obs 6° 56' N. Long. 18° 25' W.

Monday

Oct. 29th.

First part light winds from the S. S. W. and Cloudy, Middle part
squally attended with Showers of rain, latter part overcast so ends
Steering to the S. E. by the wind, in Co. with 6 Sail. - S. obs.

Tuesday

Oct. 30th.

Lat. 6° 44' N. Long. 18° 31' W.
All these 24 hours light variable winds and Calms, attended with
light Showers of rain, Steering on Different Courses.

Wednesday

Oct. 31st.

Lat. 5° 57' N. Long.
All these 24 hours light winds from the Southward and Squally
