Sunday Dec. 9th Lat. by obs 36° 09' S. - Long. by Chron. 21° 47' E.
 First part Strong winds from the E. by N. Steering to the S. -
 thenward by the wind Middle and latter part winds from the
 N. W. Steering, E. S. E. at 6 Am. set the Studding-sails, at 10
 spoke the Ship Childs Herald of London, Bound to Engl
 and so ends moderate winds and pleasant

Monday Dec. 10th Lat. 36° 22' S. - Long. 23° 43' E.
 All these 24 hours moderate winds from the N. to W. N. W. Steering
 to the E. S. E. at 6 Am. unbent the M. P. Sail and bent another latter
 part employed in repairing the M. P. Sail so ends

Tuesday Dec. 11th Lat. 36° 23' S. - Long. 25° 05' E.
 First part light variable winds and squally, attended with
 Thunder, at 6 Am. took a heavy squall from the W. tore the
 P. P. G. Sail nearly all to pieces, Carried away the Martingale Stay
 parted the back of the M. P. Sail called all hands and put the
 Ship under Close reefed P. P. M. P. Sails and P. Sails, at 10 Do. let
 two reefs out of the P. Sails, so ends strong Gales and squally
 Steering to the E. S. E. Lat. 36° 03' S. - Long. 26° 35' E. -

Wednesday Dec. 12th Commences with strong Gales from the W. and squally
 Steering to the E. S. E. under Single reefs, at Midnight

 at 8 Do. have to under a close reefed M. P. Sail and Spencers
 at Daylight set the P. Sail, Mizzen P. Sail close reefed, and let
 one reef out of the M. P. Sail, so ends overcast and hazy day

Saturday Dec. 15th Lat. 36° 32' S. - Long. 32° 47' East
 First part Strong Gales from the N. E. leading to the E. S. E.
 by the wind under Short Sail, Middle part lightning and
 thick weather attended with rain, at 2 Am. winds from
 W. N. W. Steered E. S. E. at 6 Am. set the P. P. S. Double reefed,

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and let one reef out of the M. P. Sail, so ends the Day

Sunday Dec. 16th Lat. 36° 59' S. - Long. 35° 44' E.
 Commences with Strong winds from the W. Steering to the
 E. S. E. at 5 P. M. let out the reefs and set the P. G. Sails, middle
 and latter part light winds and a heavy sea running, at 5 Am.
 set the Studding-sails so ends these 24 hours.

Monday Dec. 17th Lat. 36° 28' S. - Long. 38° 04' E.
 All these 24 hours winds from N. E. by E. to E. by N. Steering
 to the S. E. by the wind all Sail set variously employed.

Tuesday Dec. 18th Lat. 36° 59' S. - Long. 39° 54' E.
 All these 24 hours Strong winds from the N. E. Steering
 to the E. S. E. by the wind all Sail set. so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday Dec. 19th Lat. 37° 25' S. - Long. 42° 32' E.
 Commences with Strong Gales from the N. by E. Steering to the
 E. S. E. at 5 P. M. took in the P. G. Sails, at 6 Do. Single reefed the
 P. Sails, at 10 Double reefed the P. Sails, and took in the Jib, and
 Spanker thick and Cloudy attended with mists of rain, at 10 Am.
 took in the M. Sail, so ends these 24 hours
