Sunday
 March 17th. First Strong breezes from the S. Steering to the N.E. Middle part
 part heading to the Westward under short Sail, at Daylight
 nearly calm, and smoky made all Sail and Steered to the
 westward by the wind, latter part strong breezes, at 9 Am. Double
 reefed the S. Sails, so ends these 24 hours.

Monday
 March 18th. First part Strong Gales from the S. and smoky Steering to
 the S.E. latter part more moderate, unbent the M. S. Sail
 and S. Sail and bent others, Steering on Different Courses
 so ends M. S. Gallantail set

Tuesday
 March 19th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the S. to S.E. and
 smoky Steering on Different Courses employed in Sail
 mending Lat. 20-30 S. - Long 111-50 E.

Wednesday
 March 20th. Commences with light winds from the S.E. Steering to the
 the S.E. at 5 P.M. calm, at 8 Do. took daylight breeze from the
 W. S. W. at 6 Am. saw a Sperm Whale, at 4 Do. lowered
 3 Boats the S. B. fastened, at 9 Do. took the Whale to the
 Ship, at 10 Do. commenced cutting so ends these 24 hours cutting the whale

Thursday
 March 21st. At 6 P.M. finished cutting, at 9 Do. Commenced boiling
 Middle and latter part fresh breezes from the Steering
 on Different tacks by the wind so ends employed in boiling

Friday
 March 22nd. All these 24 hours Strong breezes from the Southward
 Steering Steering to the Eastward under Short Sail
 employed in boiling Lat. 20-00 S. - Long 112-52 E.

Saturday
 Mar. 23rd. Commences with Strong winds from the S. Steering to the
 Eastward by the wind at 4 P.M. finished boiling, Middle
 and latter part the light winds at 6 Am. made all Sail
 and Steered to the N.E. so ends, Strong setting S.W.

Sunday
 Mar. 24th. Commences with light winds from the S.W. Steering to the
