

Ship Triton New Bedford

At 11 Do. finished, latter part calm, so ends employed in clearing Decks &c. Lat. 20-00 S. - - Long. 112-40 E.

Monday
Mar. 25th. First part moderate winds from the S. heading to the West under Short Sail, at 1 P.M. commenced boiling, at 8 Am. more Ship, latter part strong breezes so ends boiling

Lat. 19-22 S. - - - - - Long. 112-44 E.

Tuesday
Mar. 26th. Commenced with strong winds from the S.E. and heavy heading heading to the E. under a close reefed M. P. S. and P. Sail at 3 P.M. finished boiling, at sunset took in the Fore Sail, at 2 Am. then der attended with rain, having 80 bbls. of oil on Deck called all hands and struck the most of it Down between Decks, took in the lee boots and M. P. Sail and secured the Sails, at 8 Do. reefed the Spencers at 9 Do. a complete Hurricane sometimes the lee Laritheads in the water and sometimes out, latter part winds from S.E. to E.S.E. so ends Lat. by Rec. 19-00 S. - - Long. 112-40 E.

Barometer 28-75

Wednesday
March 27th. At 3 P.M. the Barometer began to rise and the wind to moderate, the remainder of the Day nothing more than a common Gale of wind, latter part employed in hoisting out part of the oil from between Decks and Coopering it some leaking bad, so ends with winds from the S.E. W. and squally attended with showers of rain

Lat. 20-00 S. - Long. 112-27 East. strong Current setting to the Southward

Thursday
March 28th. Commenced with strong winds from the S.E. W. and squally attended with showers of rain, at sunset the rain cleared off, at 5 Am. the wind began to moderate at 6 Do. commenced breaking out the M. Hatching and making preparations stowing Down oil, at 8 got the M. P. Sail close reefed, latter part moderate winds and pleasant so ends heading to the S.W. winds from W. S. W. -

Lat. 20-18 S. - - - - - Long. 112-14 E.

Friday
March 29th. First and middle part light winds from the W. to S.W. heading to the Southward under a close reefed M. P. Sail at 7 Am. got the P. S. Sail and Steered S.E. by E. with light ares from the S.W. so ends employed in stowing Down oil

Lat. 20-26 S. - - - - - Long. 112-30 E.

on the Coast of New Holland 1839

Sat. Mar. 30th. Commenced with light ares from the S.W. Steering to the S.E. by E. at 4 P.M. finished stowing Down oil, at Sunset shortened Sail and headed to the S.E. at 6 Am. got the Boats out and made all Sail, latter part light winds from the S.E. Steering S.E. by E.

Lat. 21-21 S. - - - - - Long. 112-38 E.

Sunday
Mar. 31st. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the S.E. by E. all Sail set.

Lat. 19-41 S. - - - - - Long. 113-40 E.

Monday
April 1st. All these 24 hours fine breezes from S.E. to S.S.W. Steering on Different Courses to the Southward all Sail set, latter part employ in Coopering Provisions, Lat. 17-59 S. - Long. 114-46 E.

Tuesday
April 2nd. All these 24 hours fine breezes from the Southward and pleasant Steering on Different Courses from S.E. by E. to S.E. all Sail set variously employed about the rigging

Lat. 16-42 S. - - - - - Long. 115-39 E.

Wednesday
April 3rd. Commenced with light winds from the S. Steering to the S.E. by E. all Sail set, at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made all Sail and Steered S.W. so ends variously employed

Lat. 15-59 S. - - - - - Long. 115-53 E.

Thursday
April 4th. Commenced with light winds from the S.E. Steering to the Eastward by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail Middle and latter part strong winds from the S.E. at Daylight made all Sail, at 11 Am. tacked Ship and took in the M. P. S. Sail,

Lat. 15-25 S. - - - - - Long. 116-10 E.

Friday
April 5th. Commenced with brisk winds from the S.E. Steering to the Southward by the wind, at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made all Sail so ends Steering to the Southward

Lat. 16-51 S. - Long. by Obs. 115-34 E. - Lunar. 115-50 E.

Saturday
April 6th. All these 24 hours light winds from E.S.E. to S. Steering to the Southward by the wind, variously employed

Lat. 17-49 S. - - - - - Long. 115-07 E.

Sunday
April 7th. Commenced with light winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the Westward by the wind at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made all Sail, at 9 Am. saw 3 sperm Whales, at 10 Do. commenced 3 Boats, so ends in Pursuit of the big Fish.

Lat. by Rec. 18-20 S. - - - - - Long. 114-20 E.

Monday
April 8th. Commenced with light winds from the S. and fine weather
