

Ship Triton of New Bedford lying to Anchor.

Friday May 3rd. First part employed in stowing down oil, latter part employed in taking water cask ashore and cutting wood.

Saturday May 4th. Employed in wooding, Watering, Prodding &c. First part strong sea breezes, Middle part land breezes, latter part Calm, fine weather.

Sunday May 5th. Employed on stowing down oil water the first part, latter part 2 Boats Crews on liberty winds and weather the same.

Monday May 6th. Employed in getting wood and water one Boats Crew on liberty, winds and weather the same.

Tuesday May 7th. Employed in getting wood and water Prodding with the Natives &c. light variable winds and Calm with fine weather.

Wednesday May 8th. Employed in wooding and watering Stowing water &c.

Thursday May 9th. Employed in wooding and watering Cleaning Ship &c.

Friday May 10th. Employed in cleaning Ship and painting, one watch on liberty light wind and fine weather.

Saturday May 11th. All these 24 hours fine weather Employed in getting wood one watch on liberty.

Sunday May 12th. All these 24 hours fine weather one watch on liberty variously Employed.

Monday May 13th. Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. at Middle and latter part light winds and Calm, so ends variously Employed one watch on liberty.

Tuesday May 14th. Commences with strong winds from the S. E. and ends pleasant, at sunset the watch returned from the shore two hands short, Allen Weaklin, and Francis D. Gore deserted, at 8 P.M. Capt. P. went on shore and found Allen Weaklin and Francis took him on board the ship Middle

At Point, Lomback Island 1839.

Wednesday May 15th. Commences with strong breezes from the S. E. and pleasant at 4 P.M. the Natives found Francis D. Gore the Capt. paid them five dollars and took him on board the ship at 4 Am. got underway and steered out the harbor with breezes from the Westward in Co. with the ship two Brothers latter part light variable winds and Calm, at 8 Am. the S. E. part of Lomback bore N.W. by N. the S.W. head of Lomback bore S. E. so ends Calm.

Thursday May 16th. At 2 P.M. took a strong breeze from the S. E. Steered S. E. W. by the wind took in the P. Jib, at 4 took in the P. Topgallant sail at 5 took in the Jib and M. Sail and Double reefed the P. Sails, at sunset took in the P. J. Sailed Weaklin & Gore up in the Riggin furnished them for deserting the ship, at Daylight got the P. Top sail Double reefed Middle and latter part strong Gales from the S. E. and a heavy swell on so ends the day.

Friday May 17th. Commences with strong Gales from the S. E. Steering to the Southward by the wind under Double reef, at sunset took in the P. J. Sail, and Gore Sail, at Daylight got the Gore Sail, at 10 Am. close reefed the M. J. Sail, so ends employed in painting Boats shelling Corn.

Saturday May 18th. All these 24 hours strong Gales from the S. E. to S. and clear heading to the Southward by the wind under a close reefed M. J. Sail, and Gore Sail, Employed in painting Boats.

Sunday May 19th. Commences with strong Gales from the S. by S. heading to the Southward by the wind under a close reefed M. J. Sail and P. Sail, at 6 Am. got the P. J. Sail and Jib so ends with strong Gales, Lat. 12=18 S. Long by Rec. 115=19.

Monday May 20th. All these 24 hours strong Gales from the S. Steering to the Southward by the wind under Double reef, Lat 13=27 S. - - - Long 114=50.
