 at Sunset brought the Ship to the wind under a close
 reefed M. Topsail and 2 Spencers, at Daylight set the
 Fore Sail, strong Gales ends the Day heading S. N. E.
 Wednesday June 5th. First and Middle part strong Gales from the S. E. head-
 ing to the N. E. under short sail, latter part more mod-
 erate so ends under Double reefs, Jib and M. Sail set.
 Thursday June 6th. Commenced with Strong winds from the S. E. by E. Steer-
 ing to the N. E. by the wind under Double reefs, at Sunset
 shortened Sail, latter part fine breezes and pleasant
 all Sail set so ends employed in Sail mending
 Friday June 7th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the S. E. E.
 and fine weather Steering to the Southward by the
 wind saw a number of Finbacks
 Saturday June 8th. All these 24 hours light winds from the E. and fine
 weather Steering to the S. by the wind
 Sunday June 9th. Commenced with light winds from the E. and
 fine weather Steering to the Southward by the
 wind, at 2 P.M. saw Green Whales and lowered
 3 Boats, at 3 Do. the L. Boat fastened the Iron
 broke at the same moment, at Sunset the
 Boats returned on board without success, Middle
 part Steering on Different tacks under easy Sail, latter
 part Steering to the Southward all Sail set
 Monday June 10th. First and Middle part light winds from the E.
 to N. E. and Calms Steering to the S. E. by the wind
 latter part winds from N. N. W. and Cloudy Steer-
 ing to the S. W. so ends the Day N. E. obs.
 Lat. by Rec. 23-02 S. - - - Long. 110-30 E.

North-West Coast of New-Holland 1839.
 Tuesday June 11th. First part winds from N. W. and Cloudy Steering
 to the S. W. at sunset shortened Sail, Middle part
 variable winds and Cloudy attended with showers of
 rain latter part winds from S. W. Steering to the
 N. W. by the wind all Sail set.
 Wednesday June 12th. This Day variable winds and Cloudy Steering on
 Different Courses, at 4 P.M. spoke the Port
 Reef of New-Bedford boiling, 23 ms. out 1500 lbs.
 Capt. A went on board, at 7 Do. returned, latter part
 under single reefed Topsails so ends
 Thursday June 13th. Commenced with Strong Gales from the S. S. E. and
 Cloudy Steering to the S. W. by the wind under single
 reefs, at Sunset hove to under a close reefed M. P.
 Sail, at Daylight set the Topsails Double reefed,
 latter strong winds and squally so ends in Com-
 -any with the Reefed,
 Friday June 14th. This Day Strong winds from S. S. E. to S. and Cloudy
 attended with light squalls of rain, at 3 P.M. Capt.
 Long went on board at 6 Do. went on board his Ship
 again, so ends in Co. with the Reefed, under single
 reefs, carrying easy Sail through the night.
 Saturday June 15th. First part strong breezes from the S. E. Steering to the S. N. E.
 E. by the wind under single reefs, at Sunset shortened Sail,
 Middle and latter part light winds from the E. and fine
 weather so ends all Sail set in Co. the Reefed.
 Sunday June 16th. All these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and overcast,
 Steering on Different tacks by the wind lying under short
 Sail through the night
 Monday June 17th. This Day brisk winds from S. E. to N. E. and Cloudy Steer-
 ing on Different Courses to the Southward
 Tuesday June 18th. All these 24 Strong Gales from the N. and Cloudy, Steering
 on Different Courses to the Southward
