Wednesday June 19th. Commences with strong Gales from the N.E. and Cloudy. Steering to the S.E. under Double reef, at 3 P.M. heavy rain took in the Fore Course, Fore Topsail and Close reefed the M. Topsail headed the W. at 5 P.M. winds from N.E. and Cloudy, later part Strong Gales from the S. and Cloudy under Double reefed Topsails heading to the Westward Lat. 23-00 Long. by Lun. 111-10 E. - Long. by Chron. lately set to morning - 111-15 E.

Thursday June 20th. Commences with strong Gales from the S.E. and Cloudy Steering to the S.W. by the wind, at Sunset hove to under a Close reefed M. Topsail and spencers, latter part winds from S.E. at 6 P.M. took in the Waist Sails and set the Fore Sail, and Steered N.E. and ends the Day Lat. 23-06 S. - Long. 110-15 E.

Friday June 21st. All these 24 hours Strong Gales from S.E. to E. and Cloudy, Steering on Different Courses to the Northward under Double reefs and lying under a close reefed M. Topsail through the night so ends a heavy sea running Lat. 21-41 - Long 110-08 E.

Saturday June 22nd. This Day Strong Gales from the E. by S. and Cloudy Steering to the N. by the wind lying under Short Sail through the night Lat. 20-26 S. - Long 110-02 E.

Sunday June 23rd. All these 24 hours Strong Gales from E. to E.S.E. Steering to the N. by the wind under Double reefed Topsails lying under short sail through the night Lat 19-25 S. - Long 109-53 E.

Monday June 24th. All these 24 hours Strong Gales from E. and Cloudy Steering to the Northward by the wind under Double reefs, Lat. by obs. 18-00 S. - Long. by Rec. 110-05 E.

Tuesday June 25th. Commences with strong winds from the E. Steering N.E. by the wind under Single reefs, at Sunset Double reefed the Topsails, took in the Jib, and Main Sail, latter part Topsails set, Lat. 16-50 S. - Long 110-22 E.

Wednesday June 26th. All these 24 hours winds from the E. and fine weather Steering to the N.E. by the wind Lat. 15-17 S. - Long 110-48

Thursday June 27th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the E. and fine weather, Steering to the N.E. by the wind Lat. 14-09 S. - Long. 111-14 E.

Friday June 28th. All these 24 hours winds from the E. to E.S.E. and fine weather, Steering to the Northward by the wind Lat. 12-59 S. - Long. 112-02 E.

Saturday June 29th. Commences with brisk winds from the E. Steering to the N.E. by the wind, at sunset Double reefed the Topsails, at Daylight let out one reef set the Main Sail and wore Ship, so ends these 24 hours Lat. 12-19 S. - Long. 112-25 E.

Sunday June 30th. Commences with brisk winds from the E.S.E. Steering to the S.E. by the wind at Sunset took in the Top Gall sails, and M. Sail, latter part under Single reefs Lat. 13-24 S. - Long. 113-19 E.

Monday July 1st. All these 24 hours fine breezes from the E.S.E. and pleasant Steering to the S.E. by the wind all Sail set Lat. 14-14 S. - Long. 114-08

Tuesday July 2nd. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the E.S.E. and fine weather Steering on Different tracks by the wind Lat 14-19 S. - Long. by Rec. 114-30 - by Lun. 114-20

Wednesday July 3rd. First part light winds from the N.E. steering to the N.W. by the wind, latter part Calm, so ends the Day Lat. 13-52 S. - Long by Lun 114-01 E.

Thursday July 4th. First part Calm, at 3 P.M. took a fine breeze from the S. and Steered E. at Sunset Single reefed the Topsails, at Daylight made all Sail, latter part strong winds attended with light showers of rain, at 10 P.M. Double reefed the Topsails so ends the Day Lat. 13-44 S. - Long. 115-26 E.

Friday July 5th. Commences with strong Gales from the E.S.E. attended with showers of rain, at 2 P.M. took in the Jib and Main Sail, at 5 P.M. took in the P. Topsail, Middle and latter part Strong Gales and overcast so ends the Day Lat. 12-39 S. - Long. 116-01 E.

Saturday July 6th. All these 24 hours Strong winds from the E.S.E. Steering to the N.E. under Double reefs Lat. 11-53 S. - Long 116-27 E.
