Sunday
July 7th. First part Strong winds from E. Steering to the S.E. by the wind under Double reefs, at Sunset shortened Sail, Middle and latter part light winds and fine weather so ends all Sail set. Lat. 10-59 S. - Long. by Lun. 116-26 E.

Monday
July 8th. All these 24 hours light winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the S.E. by the wind. Lat. 10-15 S. - Long. 117-34 E.

Tuesday
July 9th. Commences with light winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the S.E. by the wind at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight made all Sail, at 7 Am. made Sandalwood Island bearing E. at Noon the middle of the I. bore S.E. 16 mi. Dis. Lat. by obs 9-30 S. -

Wednesday
July 10th. All these 24 hours winds from S.E. to E.S.E. and smoky Steering on different tacks by the wind carrying easy Sail through the night Lat. 10-11 S. - Long 118-43 E.

Thursday
July 11th. Commences with brisk winds from the S.E. and smoky Steering to the S.E. by the wind, at Sunset the nearest part of Sandalwood I. bore S.E. 12 mi. Dis. wore Ship and took in the S. Foresail, at Daylight tacked Ship, and made all Sail so ends the Day Lat. 10-23 S. - Long. 119-04 E.

Friday
July 12th. First part Steering to the E.S.E. by the wind, at 6 P.M. the nearest part of Sandalwood I. bore S.E. 15 mi. Dis. tacked Ship and shortened Sail, latter part all Sail set so ends with fresh breezes from S.E. Lat. 11-01 S. - Long. 118-45

Saturday
July 13th. All these 24 hours moderate winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the S.W. by the wind under short Sail through the night. Lat. 12-05 S. - Long. 118-20 E.

Sunday
July 14th. All these 24 hours fine breezes from the S.E. and pleasant Steering to the Southward by the wind Lat. 13-34 S. - Long. by Rec 117-42. Lunar 117-30

Monday
July 15th. All these 24 light winds from the S.E. and fine weather Steering to the Southward by the wind Lat. 14-38 S. - Long. 117-23 E.

Tuesday
July 16th. First part Calm, at 4 P.M. took a fine breeze from the S.E. at Sunset shortened Sail, at Daylight set the Foresail Double reefed, latter part Strong Gales so ends Lat. 15-13 S. - Long. 116-36 E.

Wednesday
July 17th. All these 24 hours Strong Gales from the S.E. Steering to the Southward by the wind under whole reefed Double reefed Foresails, lying under a close reefed M. Foresail and Spruce through the night Lat. 16-07 S. - Long. 115-50 E.

Thursday
July 18th. Commences with Strong Gales from the E.S.E. Steering to the Southward by the wind under Double reefs, at Sunset took in the Jib & S. Foresail, at Daylight set the S. Sails single reefed, at 10 Am. set the S. Gallantails so ends the Day Lat. 17-09 S. - Long. 115-37 East.

Friday
July 19th. This Day light winds from S.E. to S. and fine weather Steering to the S.W. by the wind, latter part saw a Sail to windward Lat. 17-47 S. - Long. 115-01 E.

Saturday
July 20th. All these 24 hours light winds from S. to S.E. and fine weather Steering to the Westward by the wind all Sail set. Lat. 18-12 S. - Long. 110-30 E.

Sunday
July 21st. Commences with light winds from the S. and fine weather Steering to the westward by the wind, at 4 P.M. spoke the Ship Bark Eliza of Salem 8 mo. out 100 bbls of Spinn oil, Middle and latter part Steering to the Eastward Lat. 18-14 S. - Long. 114-40 S.

Monday
July 22nd. Commences with brisk winds from the S. Steering to the Eastward by the wind, at 5 P.M. tacked Ship, at Sunset single reefed the Foresails, latter part Strong Gales so ends these 24 hours a Sail in sight. Lat. 18-26 S. - Long. 113-50 E.

Tuesday
July 23rd. All these 24 hours strong Gales from S. to S.E. Steering to the S.W. by the wind, at 4 Am. spoke the Bark Hudson, of Hudson so ends several Sail in sight. Lat. 19-01 S. Long 112-55 E.

Wednesday
July 24th. Commences with Strong Gales from the S.E. by S. Steering to the S.W. by the wind, under Double reefs, at Sunset took in the Jib & S. Foresail, latter part under whole Foresails, rigged in the S. Jibboom. - Lat. 19-46 S. - Long. 111-54 E.
